

## TAW Trail Condition Report (06-09-2017)

**North Fork Trinity/Hobo Gulch-** The trailhead is accessible but many trees are down on the trail. High snow melt has made creeks very high and potentially dangerous. Hikers report the crossings of Rattlesnake Creek and the NF Trinity to be dangerous and potentially impassible. Both Papoose Lake and Grizzly Lake are under snow and Frozen, and their approaches are under snow as well.

**Canyon Creek-** Lower Canyon Creek Lake and Boulder Creek Lake are melting out, however the higher lakes are under snow. The creek crossings above the Boulder Creek junction are high due to snow melt and will get higher in the afternoon as snow melt increases. No fires at any of the Lakes up CC.

**East Weaver Lake-** The TH is under snow.

**Dolly Ditch TR-** One mile of the trail off weaver Bally Road is free of trees, but hikers can pass the whole way. Makes a nice day hike while the high country is snowed in.

**Rush Creek-** TH is accessible, trail conditions unknown.

**Stuart Fork-** the Deep Creek Bridge is closed, making a ford of Deep Creek necessary. The trail is free of snow until Emerald Lake, with patchy snow below Sapphire Lake. Trees have been cleared up to the Alpine Lake junction. Alpine Lake is inaccessible from Stuart FK. because the ford is impassible and will be until August.

**Stoney Ridge-** Hikers report the pass is still well under snow with a dangerous cornice at the top. Not recommended at this time.

**Granite Peak TR-** Unknown conditions but snow is still lingering at least 1-2 miles below the peak.

**Long Canyon-** The first 4 to 5 miles of the trail are free of snow but the lakes and passes are under snow. Proceed with caution.

**Swift Creek/Granite Lake-** Most campsites at Granite Lake are free of snow and the trail is melted out as well. Seven Up Pass is well under snow and dangerous. The main stem of the Swift Creek Trail is free of snow until Parker Meadow, with patchy snow before Mumford Meadow. All lakes and side trail are likely under snow.

**Lake Eleanor TR-** The TH is accessible but trail conditions are unknown.

**Poison Canyon-** The TH is accessible but trail conditions are unknown.

**Boulder Lake Trail-** Unknown Road and Trail conditions. As of the start of June the road was still snow covered.

**Boulder Creek Trail-** The TH is accessible but trail conditions are unknown.

**Sugar Pine-** The TH is accessible but trail conditions are unknown.

**Union Creek-** Union Lake is accessible with some patchy snow. The passes above connecting it to other water sheds are under snow.

**Big Flat (all trails)-** Expect difficult crossings of the Salmon River due to snow melt. The TH is accessible but trail conditions are unknown.

**Adams Lake-** The TH is accessible but trail conditions are unknown.

**Lady Gulch-** The TH is accessible but trail conditions are unknown.

**South Fork Coffee Creek-** The trail is free of snow until the ridges, but many trees are reported to be down.

**North Fork Coffee Creek-** The trail is free of snow until the ridges. Logs have been cleared until the second bridge/junction with the Granite Creek Trail.

**East Fork Coffee Creek-** The trail is Free of snow to within 2 miles of Stoddard Lake, however many trees are down.

**Billy's Peak TR-** The TH is accessible but trail conditions are unknown.

**Stoddard Lake TR-** There is patchy snow starting one mile in and Stoddard Lake is under snow. The first 2 miles of trail have been cleared of logs.

**Eagle Creek Benches-** Conditions unknown but the first 6 miles should be free of snow.

**Bear Lake-** Snow begins one mile before the lake.

**Tangle Blue-** Snow begins one mile before the lake.

**Scott Mtn-** Expect snow on ridgelines and at lakes. The TH is accessible but trail conditions are unknown.
