The McClure Campground is located on the south side of McClure Pass. Nearby recreation opportunities include four-wheel driving roads, hiking trails, motorized trails and the historic town of Marble. The campground sits at the head of Lee Creek. It is in open from Memorial Day Weekend through the 31st of October. The maximum stay limit is 14 nights. There are 10 camp sites with an average spur length of 35 feet, one site is pull through and will accommodate longer RV's. There is a maximum of 8 people and two cars per site. This campground is not on the reservation system and operates on a first come first serve basis. Each site has a picnic table and fire/grill ring. There is a vault toilet, but no potable water, no trash service so Pack-it In, Pack-it Out, no camp host, and no fee for camping. Bear proof food storage containers are required in all GMUG campgrounds. McClure campground is managed by the Forest Service, Paonia Ranger District and operates on funds provided by Gunnison Energy Corporation.

FIRE SAFETY:

Drinking Water:

DO NOT drink water directly from a river or stream. Water needs to be treated first by either filtering, boiling for at least 10 minutes or treating with iodine tablets.



Multiple use:

As you use this area you may notice that the Forest is managed for a broad range of uses. Recreation use alone includes hiking, horseback riding, hunting, snowmobiling and sightseeing. In addition, the vegetation in the Forest requires some form of management. Timber harvest and livestock grazing are both forms of land management you may encounter while using this area. The livestock grazing on this area is managed in a very progressive and specific manner. The fences and gates that you may see are critical to managing the livestock and meeting the resource objectives that are planned for this area. Please close all gates that you open as you travel through the area. Controlling the livestock in the manner that we have planned is important.

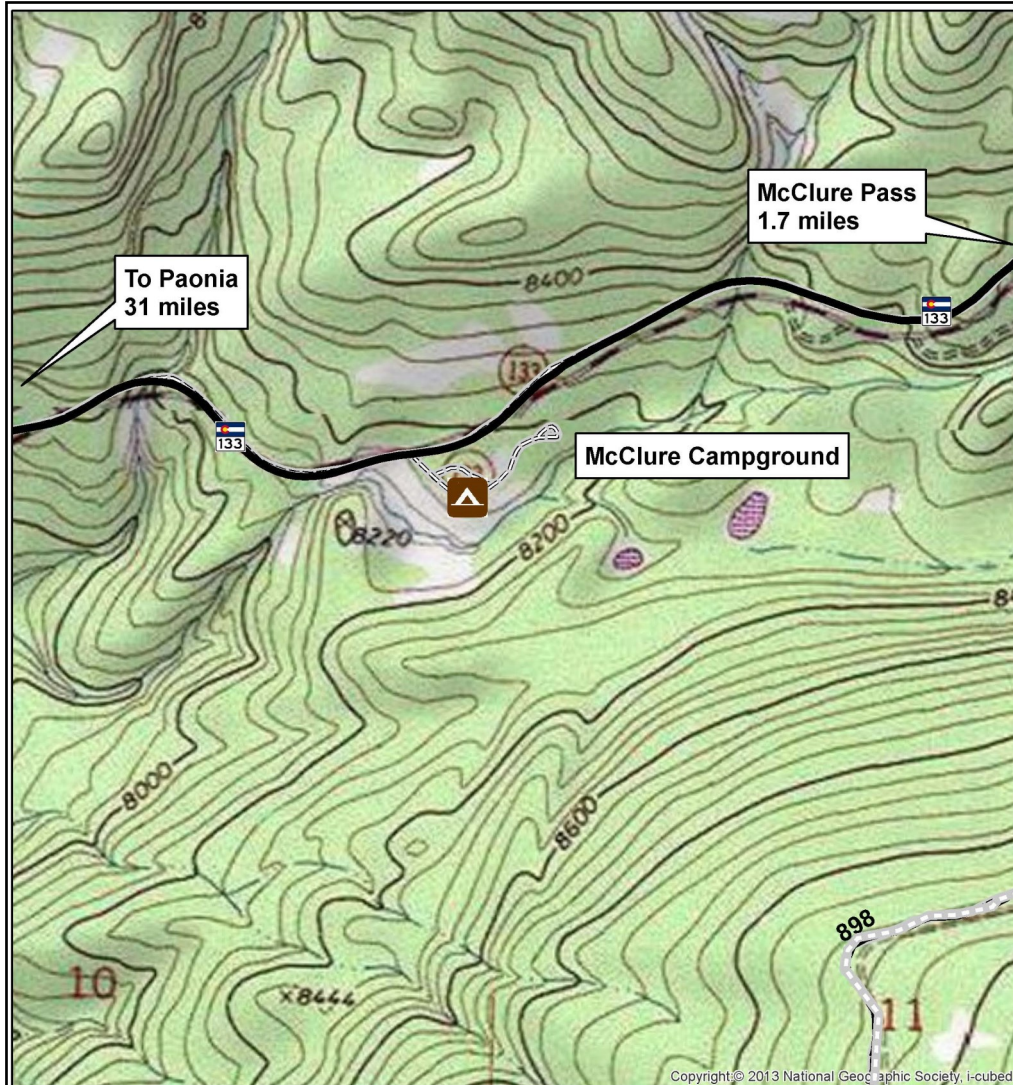
