FOREST ORDER NO. 06-06-06-17-07

Indian Creek Fire Closure

Pursuant to 16 USC § 551 and 36 CFR § 261.50 (a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on the Hood River Ranger District of the Mt Hood National Forest and the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area (CRGNSA), as shown on the attached map (Exhibit A). These prohibitions will become effective August 24, 2017, and will remain in effect until October 15th, 2017, or until rescinded.

PROHIBITIONS:

1. **Being on a trail.** [36 CFR § 261.55(a)]
2. **Going into or being upon an area.** [36 CFR § 261.52(e)]
3. **Being on a road.** [36 CFR § 261.54(e)]

CLOSURE AREA DESCRIPTION:

All methods of travel are prohibited on the following National Forest System (NFS) Trails:

- Eagle Creek Trail No. 440, beginning 3.3 miles southwest of the Eagle Creek Trailhead at High Bridge and ending at its terminus where it intersects with the Pacific Crest Trail.
- Eagle Benson Trail No. 434 for its entire length.
- Indian Springs Trail No. 435 for its entire length
- Eagle Tanner Trail No. 433 for its entire length.
- Tanner Butte Trail No. 401 for its entire length.
- Chinidere Cutoff Trail No. 406M for its entire length.

All occupancy and use of the following developed recreation sites are prohibited:

- Wahtum Lake Campground and Trailhead
- Indian Springs Campground

All methods of travel is prohibited on the following National Forest System (NFS) roads:

- NFS Road No. 1310 east of the junction with NFS Rd No. 1311 to its terminus at Wahtum Lake Area Closure.
- All areas within Indian Creek Fire Closure as shown on Exhibit A.


EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to Title 36 CFR §261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

- (1) Any person with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
- (2) Any Federal, State, or local official or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR part 261, subpart A.

Violations of these prohibitions are punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. (16 U.S.C. 551, and 18 U.S.C. 3559 and 3571)
