Occupancy and Use

Pursuant to 16 United States Code (U.S.C.) § 551 and 36 Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.) § 261.50 (a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on all National Forest System Roads in the South Platte Ranger District, Pike National Forest (the "Restricted Roads") and within ¼ mile of the Restricted Roads (the "Restricted Areas"), which are National Forest System lands within Clear Creek, Douglas County, Jefferson, Park and Teller Counties, Colorado, as depicted on the attached map hereby incorporated into this order as Exhibit A.

The purpose of this Order is to the protecton of natural resources and public health and safety.

PROHIBITIONS:

1. Camping within the Restricted Areas unless in a developed campground or designated dispersed campsite provided by the Forest Service. 36 C.F.R. 261.58(e)
2. Parking on the Restricted Roads or within the Restricted Areas unless in a developed campground or designated parking site that are designated and provided by the Forest Service. 36 C.F.R. 261.58(g)

EXCEPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. 261.50 (e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
2. Person with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.

This Order shall remain in effect from the date signed, for five years, or until rescinded, whichever event occurs first.

Violations of these prohibitions are punishable as a Class B misdemeanor, by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C. §§ 3559 and 3571
