

# TRACY RIDGE RECREATION AREA

**FINDING THE AREA** – Tracy Ridge Recreation Area is located on State Route 321, north of the junction with SR 59 and south of the junction with SR 346. Tracy Ridge sits on a ridgetop three miles east of the Allegheny Reservoir.

**FACILITIES** – There are 119 spacious tree-shaded campsites, each containing a picnic table and fire ring. Hand-pumped water, vault toilets, and a trailer dump station are also available. Firewood may be obtained from dead and down trees.

**RESERVATIONS** – This recreation area is frequently used as a group camping site. Group facilities allow large gatherings of families, churches, Scouts, etc., to camp together.

Some sites are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Selected campsites are available for reservation by calling:

A reservation fee will be charged for family units and for group units. For a three-day holiday weekend, you must reserve a site for at least two nights. Reservations for family sites can be made 4 to 240 days in advance; group sites can be reserved 3 to 360 days in advance. The Forest Service does not take reservations.

For campers not using the reservation system, payment at the campground is by cash or check only at the self-service fee station.

**OTHER FEATURES** – The Tracy Ridge Hiking Trail System (marked with gray blazes) offers 33.69 miles of interconnecting loops in the area. The trails link up with the North Country National Scenic Trail, marked with blue blazes. Loop hikes, leading to the reservoir, can be made from the campground using the Tracy Ridge Trails and the North Country National Scenic Trail. One feature of these trails is the large, scenic rock formations along their routes.

## ALLEGHENY NATIONAL FOREST RECREATION AREAS RULES

- Permissible length of stay is fourteen (14) days. Leaving your campsite unoccupied during the first night after equipment has been set up, or leaving equipment for more than 24 hours thereafter, is prohibited.
- Please be considerate of other campers. Quiet time is from 10:00 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Check out time is 2:00 p.m. Camping fees must be paid by 2:00 p.m. Don't forget to put your site number and your license plate number on your fee envelope.
- Campsites should not be used by more than eight persons. Each campsite contains a picnic table, fire ring or grill, and accommodates a tent and parking for two vehicles and a wheeled camping unit. Additional vehicles will be charged a fee and must park in public parking areas. Other recreation equipment associated with a campsite (boats, trailers, jet skis, motorcycles) are not charged. Park all vehicles on the campsite spur, not on the grass.
- Weapons, firearms, and fireworks must not be discharged in this area.
- Waste material from trailers must be deposited at a dump station. Please place trash in the provided receptacles.
- Please build fires only in designated fireplaces. Dead material, on the ground, may be used for fires, but living trees, shrubs, and plants must not be cut or damaged.
- Please don't pound nails into trees, picnic tables, and other government property; they are unsightly, and may create a safety hazard. Heat from lanterns hung on trees can burn or damage trees. Pet leashes wrapped around tree trunks wear bark away and may eventually kill the tree.
- Pets must be kept on a leash, and are not allowed on beaches or in the water.
- No camping is allowed in picnic areas.






