New technologies and processes are being used to safely and efficiently gather information on the postfire condition, and weekly training sessions are being held to share these new technologies and processes, along with the available data, with Forest Service employees across the Northern Region.

Reforestation

West Fork / Kootenai NF



Nearly every large fire in the Region has been assessed for reforestation needs following the 2017 fire season. These assessments are a preliminary tool which combines remote sensing and local knowledge. Field reconnaissance in 2018 will further refine the reforestation workload resulting from the 2017 fire season. Based on these assessments and prior year needs, the region is working on a 5-year reforestation needs document to help identify and plan future reforestation work.

Mushrooms

Forests across the Northern Region are anticipating a busy Morel mushroom season this spring, and planning is underway to prepare for an influx of mushroom hunters.

The Forest Service will complete an environmental analysis to assess potential impacts, and coordinate commercial mushroom harvest activities across multiple Forests impacted by the 2017 fire season.

Briefings

Forest Service staff met with the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes (CSKT) Tribal Council on January 23. The Tribal Council was briefed on the Northern Region post-fire response and had an opportunity to comment and ask questions.

Northern Region Deputy Regional Forester Dave Schmid along with other regional staff were recently invited to brief several Montana legislative interim committees in Helena regarding the 2017 wildfires as well as the Region's post-fire recovery efforts. Specifically, information was provided for the Montana legislative water policy interim committee (January 8) and the Montana environmental quality council (January 18).
