

While paddling on a small creek you encounter a beaver dam that spans the creek. What should you do to traverse the dam?

- a) Portage around it.
- b) Drag your canoe over it.

If you chose

- a) Add a solid red wedge—portaging the canoe prevents damage to the dam.
- b) Add a striped red wedge—dragging the canoe damages the dam, requires beavers to repair the dam, and changes water levels that affect the organisms which live in or near the water.

Gray jays are all over your camp and your friend wants to feed one from his hand. What should he do?

- a) Grab a piece of bread or other food and walk closer to the birds to feed them.
- b) Avoid offering any food to the birds and instead observe them from a distance.

If you chose

- a) Add a striped red wedge—feeding the birds, and attracting them and other wildlife to humans, alters the birds' natural behavior.
- b) Add a solid red wedge—refusing to feed the birds prevents them, and other wildlife, from coming too close to humans or eating human food.

You see a huge eagle nest down the lake through your binoculars. The nest is near the campsite where you planned to stay for the night. Where should you camp?

- a) At that campsite.
- b) At a different campsite.

If you chose

- a) Add no wedge—choosing the original campsite disturbs the eagles and forces them to leave the nest and the eggs or chicks unattended. Between March 1 and May 15 campers are not allowed to camp within half of a mile of nesting eagles.
- b) Add a solid red wedge—choosing a different campsite prevents a disturbance to the eagles, keeping the chicks safe.

Your dog loves to go camping and swim in the water. What should you do with your dog on your next camping trip?

- a) Leave her at home.
- b) Bring her but keep her on a leash and in control at all times.
- c) Bring her and let her run.

If you chose

- a) Add a solid red wedge and a bonus chip or flip over a striped red wedge to reveal the solid colored side—leaving her at home prevents her from disturbing or injuring wildlife.
- b) Add a solid red wedge—restraining her minimizes disturbances to wildlife.
- c) Add a striped red wedge—bringing her disturbs or injures wildlife.

It's the end of the night and you are ready for bed. What should you do with your food?

- a) Wrap it in a tarp and place it under the canoe.
- b) Pack it in a bag and hang it from a 10-foot tall tree.

If you chose

- a) Add a striped red wedge—leaving it on the ground attracts small critters (mice) and large ones (bears).
- b) Add a solid red wedge—hanging it from a tree decreases the chance of an animal getting into your food or coming near humans.

What should you do if you want to get a closer look at the nesting osprey across the lake?

- a) Paddle closer to see it.
- b) Look at it through binoculars.

If you chose

- a) Add a striped red wedge—paddling closer to the osprey disturbs her and forces her to leave her nest and the eggs or chicks unattended.
- b) Add a solid red wedge—maintaining distance allows the osprey to remain in her nest and protect her young.

What should you do when you are fishing from shore and your line gets tangled in the trees?

- a) Cut it and leave it.
- b) Untangle it and pack it in the trash.

If you chose

- a) Add a striped red wedge—leaving it is unsightly for others visitors and risks catching or injuring animals.
- b) Add a solid red wedge—packing it out leaves no trace of your visit.

You see a female mallard (a duck) swim by with her newly hatched ducklings. What should you do?

- a) Follow them to see how they swim.
- b) Stay silent as they swim by.
- c) Paddle farther away from them.

If you chose

- a) Add a striped red wedge—following them frightens the ducklings, risks separating them from their mother, and increases the possibility of injury.
- b) Add a solid red wedge—remaining silent allows the ducklings to stay with their mother, safe from danger.
- c) Add a solid red wedge and a bonus chip or flip over a striped red wedge to reveal the solid colored side—by paddling away, you do not disturb the mallard and her ducklings.
