The Monument:

On April 15, 2000, President Bill Clinton created the Giant Sequoia National Monument.

The monument encompasses approximately 328,000 acres within the 1.1 million acre Sequoia National Forest.

The proclamation creating the monument included new direction for use and management of mountain bikes within the monument.

- Mountain bike use is permitted only on designated roads and trails within the monument.
- Bicycle use is **not** permitted off of roads or trails within the monument.
- Mountain bike use outside of the monument was not affected by the proclamation.
- Mountain bike use is still prohibited within all designated wilderness areas.
