Summer Series

Join the Elden Pueblo staff for monthly local hikes this summer, to classic prehistoric cultural sites on the Coconino National Forest. Explore the rich geological landscape, and the human history intertwined with the land.

The **Elden Neighborhood** walk moves you through history in a 2-mile radius. From prehistoric pueblos, and its associated "outliers", to railroad logging, ranching, trails and road building; it's been a busy area for centuries.

Turkey Tanks hike brings you to San Francisco Wash, highlighting the use of natural resources to survive and even thrive in this high-country environment. Carpool required.

Medicine Fort & Cave is a view of earlier Cohonina culture architecture and classic cave dwellings found in the area. Note: Steep terrain access to cave. Carpool required.
