




Finding Your Way

This post is found at all trail intersections and crossings. You can use these markers to help you stay on the designated routes.

This marker is found at each trailhead. It tells you the type of vehicle permitted, trail number and degree of difficulty.

IMPORTANT: MOTOR VEHICLE USE
The Foresthill Off Highway Vehicle Guide is designed to be used with the **Motor Vehicle Use Maps (MVUM)** for the Tahoe National Forest. The MVUM shows National Forest System roads, National Forest System trails, and the areas on the National Forest System lands in the Tahoe National Forest that are designated for motor vehicle use pursuant to 36 CFR 212.51.
National Forest road, trail, and area users must comply with the Motor Vehicle Use Map, as well as Federal, State, and local laws and regulations. Compliance with these rules is the responsibility of the user.
