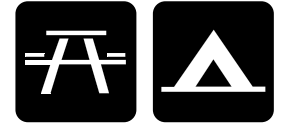

Backcountry Campsites

USFS backcountry sites on Lake Vermilion feature a picnic table, fire grate and wilderness-style latrine. Each site is available on a first-come, first-served basis and permits or fees are not required. Group size is limited to 9 people or fewer at each campsite. While visiting the Superior National Forest, please remember to use *Leave No Trace* skills and ethics.

Leave No Trace Principles



1. Plan ahead and prepare.
2. Travel and camp on durable surfaces.
3. Dispose of waste properly.
4. Minimize use and impact of campfires.
5. Respect wildlife.
6. Leave what you find.
7. Be considerate of others.

Shore Lunch Sites

Shore lunch sites are similar to backcountry sites but feature a dock in addition to a picnic table, fire grate, and wilderness-style latrine.

Each shore lunch site is intended for day use only. The docks are not strong enough for houseboat mooring. **Overnight camping is not allowed.** After enjoying the site, please back out all litter and garbage. Make sure your campfire is completely out.

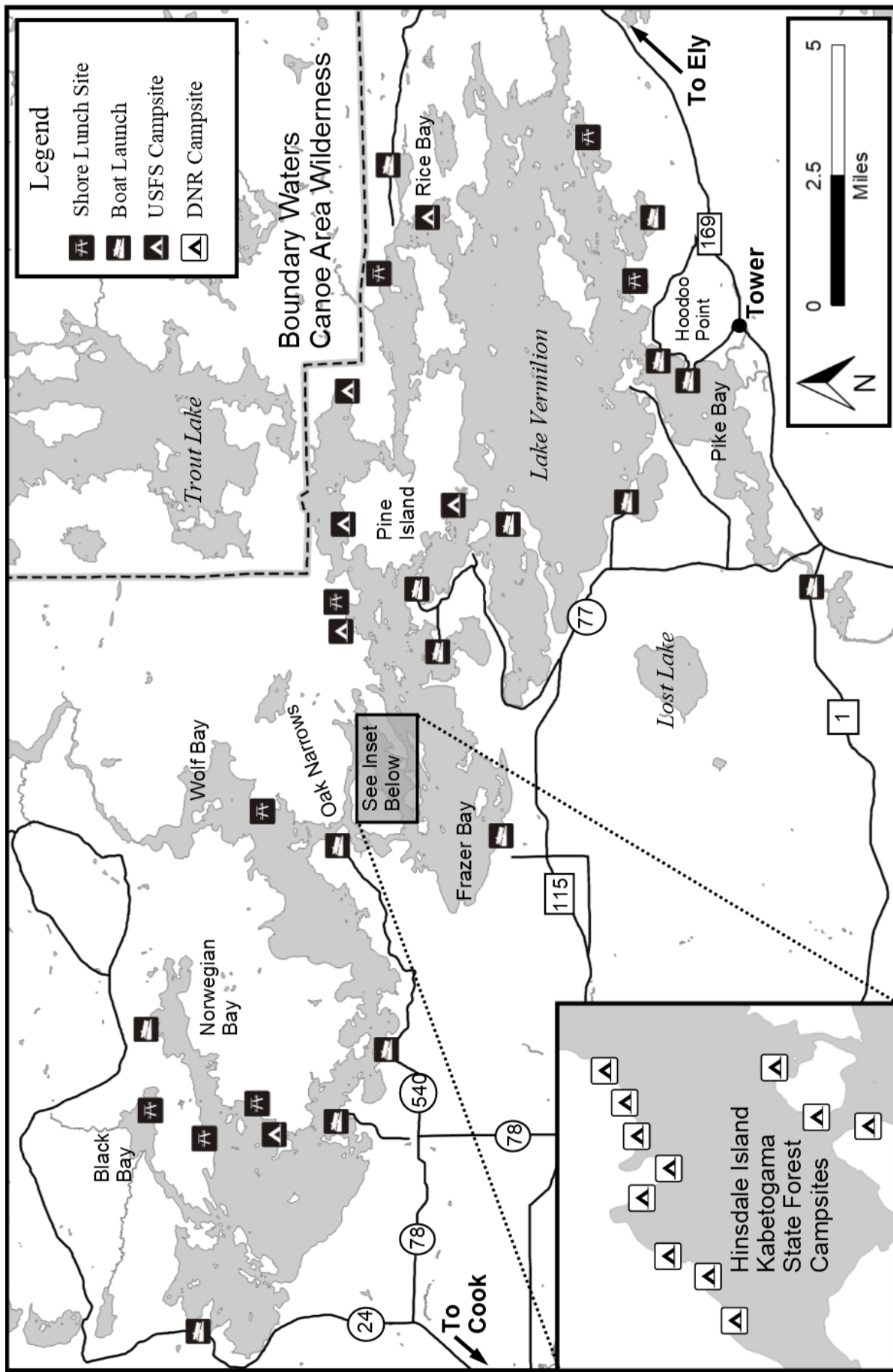
