Road	Name	Status	Date	Condition
223	Selway	OPEN	9/14/20	Pavement ends 2 miles east of Fenn Ranger Station. The road continues as a gravel road with little elevation gain. The road has been graded to Race Creek this spring but will have potholes, will be wash boardie and dusty, watch for down trees along the road to Selway Falls. Please drive slow and with caution! Rocks may be present. Selway Falls is visible along this route.
290	Indian Hill	Road Use Restricted	9/14/20	Road is CLOSED to Full-Size Motorized Vehicles. Road is OPEN to ATVs & UTVs 50" or less, Two Wheeled Motorized Vehicles, Foot Traffic, Horse/Stock, and Bicycles. (Forest Supervisor's Order #01-17-06-19-007)
317	Coolwater	Closed to all Size Vehicles	9/14/20	Closed for approximately three miles from the gate near the junction of the Selway River Road. Weekend Travel is Not Permitted - Due to logging operation & repairing slides. Forest Order #01-17-06-20-001
319	Fog Mountain	Closed to Full Size Vehicles	9/14/20	The road has been narrowed by washouts. The road is CLOSED TO ALL MOTORIZED VEHICLES greater than 50 inches wide. (Forest Supervisor's Order #01-17-06-17-007)
443	Falls Point	Closed/ Closure on Roadway	9/14/20	Road closed to ALL MOTORIZED VEHICLES from the junction with Indian Hill Rd. SW to the gate at milepost 24, approximately one mile south of Falls Point. Visitors can walk into Slims Camp and Meadow Creek Trail. (Forest Supervisor's Order #01-17-06-17-016)
470	Swiftwater	OPEN	9/14/20	Travelers may experience potholes, rocks & soft spots along roadway making travel difficult. Please drive slowly and with caution!
651	O'Hara	OPEN	9/14/20	Travelers may experience potholes, rocks & soft spots along roadway making travel difficult. Please drive slowly and with caution!

### Forest Road Check List

Watch for & obey posted speed limits. Forest Service roads can be narrow, rocky, & not meant for high speeds.

Be careful braking on gravel roads. Allow more time and distance when coming to a stop.

**Beware of rocks, boulders, road washouts, downed trees and brush on the roadway.**

Use appropriate tires for the terrain and conditions you'll be traveling.

Remember to stay on authorized roads.

Plan appropriately for food, gas, and lodging, which may not be readily available along Forest Service roads.

Always carry extra food and water.

Always let someone know your plans and stick to those plans.
