

PURPOSE AND CONTENTS OF THIS MAP

The designations shown on this motor vehicle use map (MVUM) were made by the responsible official pursuant to 36 CFR 212.51...

Designation of a road, trail, or area for motor vehicle use by a particular class of vehicle under 36 CFR 212.51 should not be interpreted as encouraging or inviting use...

This motor vehicle use map identifies those roads, trails, and areas designated for the motor vehicle use under 36 CFR 212.51 for the purpose of enforcing the prohibition...

These designations apply only to National Forest System roads, National Forest System trails, and areas on National Forest System lands.

Designated roads, trails and areas may also be subject to temporary, emergency closures. As a visitor, you must comply with signs notifying you of such restrictions...

Violators of 36 CFR 261.13 are subject to a fine of up to \$5,000, imprisonment for up to 6 months, or both...

This map does not display nonmotorized uses, over-snow uses, or other facilities and attractions on the Black Hills National Forest.

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Legend: Roads Open to Highway Legal Vehicles Only, Special Designation: Trails Open to Vehicles 62" or Less in Width, Dispersed Camping / Elk Retrieval, Elk Retrieval (ER) Zone, Interstate, Highways, U.S. State or Other Public Roads, Motorized Trailhead, Picnic Area, Information Site, Peaks, Forest or Unit Boundary, National Forest System Lands, Non-National Forest System Lands within the National Forest, Political Boundary, Township and Range Lines, Section Lines, Lakes.

EXPLANATION OF LEGEND ITEMS: Roads Open to Highway Legal Vehicles Only, Roads Open to All Vehicles, Special Designation: Trails Open to Vehicles 62 inches or Less in Width, Trails open only to motor vehicles 62 inches or less in width at the widest point on the vehicle.

PROHIBITIONS: It is prohibited to possess or operate a motor vehicle on National Forest System lands on the Black Hills National Forest other than in accordance with these designations (36 CFR 261.13). Violators of 36 CFR 261.13 are subject to a fine of up to \$5,000, imprisonment for up to 6 months, or both (18 U.S.C. 571(b)).

OPERATOR RESPONSIBILITIES: Operating a motor vehicle on National Forest System roads, National Forest System trails, and in areas on National Forest System lands carries a greater responsibility than operating that vehicle in a city or other developed setting. Motor vehicle use, especially off-highway vehicle use, involves inherent risks that may cause property damage, serious injury, and possibly death to participants.


BLANKET TRAVEL MANAGEMENT STATEMENTS: Roads and Trails requiring Permits: Motorized Trails in the South Dakota portion of the Black Hills National Forest require vehicles to display a Black Hills National Forest Motorized Trail Permit.

Seasonal Trail Designation Table: Table with columns for Trail Number, Allow, Begining Mile Post, Ending Mile Post, and dates for 5/15-12/15.

DISPERSED CAMPING and ELK RETRIEVAL Tab: Motor vehicle use of designated roads and trails for the purpose of dispersed camping and/or elk retrieval is permitted for up to 200 feet from the centerline of the road or trail...

ELK RETRIEVAL is allowed under the following conditions: When an elk has been legally taken, the individual who legally took the elk may drive or be driven through the elk's carcass...

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
