

Fawn Stew Pre-Offer Meeting Notes

Q-1) Does designation by prescription trigger the Forest Service to have the unit of measure be tons on sales?

A-1) Yes, Forest Service policy dictates the unit of measure be tons if designation by prescription is used.

Q-2) Does marking need to be cut tree or leave tree?

A-2) Making is not a requirement in this contract, but contractor may choose to identify cut or leave trees as long as the end result achieves the silvicultural prescription as written the contract. * Use of paint needs to be approved by FS prior the use.

Q-3) Who should address engineering question?

A-3) Contact contracting officer josh.kenfield@usda.gov or contract and appraisals specialist erin.kidwell@usda.gov and they can supply contact information for an engineering representative.

Q-4) Road closing project is confusing, can additional info be provided?

A-4) Additional road closure maps are posted on the web site. The maps are for guidance, pre-work meeting and on the ground evaluations may require adjustments.

Q-5) Why isn't Hood River County part of the local workforce counties?

A-5) Decision was made to not change the local workforce counties for Fawn Stew DXP and use Clackamas, Marion, and Linn Counties in Oregon as the highest tier. District Ranger and Staff may revisit this topic on future contracts.

Q-6) How are the technical proposals ratings, ordered and weighted?

A-6) Proposals are evaluated by the district technical evaluation board and rated based on the evaluation criteria. The team's results are presented to the contracting officer to make a determination with the District Ranger on the proposals. * Reference - **Additional information in development of technical proposals.** *
