ORDER # 06-03-00-20-05
FOREST ORDER
OCCUPANCY AND USE

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50 (a), and to provide for public health and safety, the following acts are prohibited in the areas described in this order within the administrative boundaries of the Gifford Pinchot National Forest. This Order will become effective upon signature and shall be in effect until rescinded, but no later than March 26, 2021.

This Order supersedes and rescinds Order No. 06-03-00-20-04.

PROHIBITION:

1. It is prohibited to enter or use a Developed Recreation Site or portion thereof. **§ 261.58 (b)**
2. Being on a road as described in the "Closure area" section below. **§36 CFR 261.54 (e)**

CLOSURE AREA

All developed recreation sites within the boundaries of the Gifford Pinchot National Forest as displayed on **Map exhibit A**. *Developed recreation site* means an area which has been improved or developed for recreation, **§ 36 CFR 261.2**

Gifford Pinchot National Forest Roads 81, 83, and 8303, and portions of National Forest Road 90, as displayed on **Map exhibit B**.

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR § 261.50 (e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
3. Volunteers and hosted enrollees (defined as any non-Forest Service employee that is officially participating in a Forest Service program).
4. Persons identified as "Essential Critical Infrastructure Workers" by Governor Jay Inslee's Proclamation 20-25, dated March 23, 2020, in the performance of their official duties.
5. Persons conducting essential travel to or from a home, residence, or work place: for obtaining necessary supplies and services, engaging in activities essential for health and safety, caring for a family member, friend, or pet in another household or residence and to transport a family member, friend, or their pet for essential health and safety activities,


and to obtain necessary supplies and services, and other travel consistent with the State of Washington and guidance from the Washington Department of Health.

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FOREST SERVICE

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

Violations of these prohibitions are punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 for an individual or \$10,000.00 for a corporation or imprisonment for not more than six months or both. Title 16 USC Section 551.
