





Nationally Directed Projects

- Participating in National Policy discussions around services provided to employees and family members around Serious Injury, LODD and Invitational Travel.
 - Helping to evaluate whether the radio cache could be moved into the Working Capital Fund (WCF) by calculating alternatives.
 - Assisting the Washington Office to evaluate Infrared / Fire Imaging capabilities to support fire operations by standing up a Fire Imaging Technology Steering Committee, establishing charter/objectives and identifying needs for fire imaging from the Incident Management Teams (IMTs), fire managers, and Agency Administrators (AAs).

- Conducting a program review of the Wildland Firefighter Apprentice Program (WFAP) to assist with development of strategic framework for the next 5-10 years
- Serving as a Subject Matter Expert (SME) for the National Park Service (NPS) review of large fires to determine what IMT configurations are the best for managing fires to meet NPS objectives.
- Developing Infrared (IR) needs assessment at different stages of detection and response for IR Task Force
- Representing WO-FAM Assistant Director areas for Doctrine, Learning and Risk Management on Leapfrog Group
- Developing and coordinating the National Accelerated Training Program (NATP)
- Participating on the Death & Serious Injury task team
- Providing coordination, facilitation, public affairs and logistical support to the National Fire Hire Program
- Assessing how National Hiring & Recruitment is implemented and make recommendations on how to better utilize resources.



- Assisting the All Hazard and International Fire Support Branch to come up with atypical ways to increase firefighting capacity during periods of significant national activity.
