FOREST ORDER NO. 08-11-07-20-071-3

Termination Notices for Previous Orders: The Pisgah National Forest is gradually reopening sites, trails, and areas which were previously closed. Each successive Forest Order includes fewer closed sites, trails, and roads, and supersedes and terminates the previous Forest Order.

- The *first* Forest Order, No. 08-11-07-20-071, was issued on April 13, 2020, and was terminated on May 14, 2020, with the issuance of the *second* Forest Order, No. 08-11-07-20-071-2.
- This *third* Forest Order, No. 08-11-07-20-071-3, supersedes and hereby terminates the *second* Forest Order, No. 08-11-07-20-071-2, which was issued on May 14, 2020.

New Forest Order. Pursuant to Title 16 U.S.C. § 551 and Title 36 C.F.R. § 261.50, this *third* Forest Order, No. 08-11-07-20-071-3, prohibits the following acts on the Pisgah National Forest to protect public health and safety. The Pisgah National Forest is comprised of the Pisgah, Grandfather and Appalachian Ranger Districts. This Forest Order is effective from the date signed by the Forest Supervisor until August 1, 2020, or until terminated by an authorized Forest Service official, whichever occurs first.

Prohibitions. The following acts are prohibited:

- 1. Using any motor vehicle on the National Forest System road. 36 C.F.R § 261.54(a). See Exhibit A (list) and Exhibits B, C, D (maps) which are attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 2. Being on a National Forest System trail. 36 C.F.R. § 261.55(a). See Exhibit A (list) and Exhibits B, C, D (maps) which are attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 3. Entering or using a developed recreation site or portion thereof. 36 CFR § 261.58(b). See Exhibit A (list) and Exhibits B, C, D (maps) which are attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 4. Camping within 1,000 feet of a road on the Pisgah Ranger District. 36 CFR § 261.58(e). See Exhibit D (map) which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Exemptions. Pursuant to 36 C.F.R § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

- (a) Persons with a permit issued by the applicable District Ranger which specifically authorizes the otherwise prohibited act or omission, such as permits authorizing maintenance on utility infrastructure and corridors.
- (b) Owners or lessees of land within the area, to the extent necessary to access their land.
- (c) Residents within the area, to the extent necessary to access their residences.
- (d) Any Federal, State or local officer or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
- (e) Persons engaged in any of the following activities which have been authorized in writing by a permit, contract, or agreement:

- (1) grazing and livestock use, 36 C.F.R. Part 222 (§§ 222.1 222.76);
- (2) timber and special forest products use, 36 C.F.R. Part 233 (§§ 223.1 223.305); and
- (3) mineral use, 36 C.F.R. Part 228 (36 C.F.R. §§ 228.1 228.116);
- (f) Persons with a Forest Permit for Use of Roads, Trails, or Areas Restricted by Regulation or Order, Form FS-7700-48, specifically exempting them from the effect of this Order.

Other Prohibitions. These prohibitions are in addition to:

- (a) the General Prohibitions at 36 C.F.R. §§ 261.1–261.23 (Subpart A);
- (b) other Orders currently in effect pursuant to 36 C.F.R. §§ 261.50–261.58 (Subpart B); and
- (c) all other Regional Regulations at 36 C.F.R. § 261.70 (Subpart C).
