

Visiting the Maroon Bells by Shuttle in 2020

Due to COVID-19, visiting the Maroon Bells is a little different this year. Adhering to the following tips will help make your visit an enjoyable one while keeping visitors and staff healthy and safe.

Before You Arrive

- **Make a reservation in advance** at aspenchamber.org/maroon-bells, and make sure you have your shuttle reservation ticket when you arrive. Save it to your phone or print it and bring it with you.
- **Pack and plan to bring the essentials**, including sunscreen, rain gear, a face covering, food, and water.
- **Plan ahead to catch a shuttle back down before 3:00 PM**. Later shuttles experience crowding. Getting back earlier helps to maintain social distancing requirements, keeping everyone healthy and safe.

When You Arrive

- **Park** at the Aspen Highlands parking deck **or**
- **Take** the Castle/Maroon RFTA bus from Rubey Park to Aspen Highlands.
- **Leave** the deck by walking upstairs.
- **Show** the attendant your shuttle reservation ticket.
- **Wear** your face covering while boarding and riding the bus. All passengers (except children under 2 years of age) **must** wear face coverings.
- **Board** the bus by maintaining appropriate social distance.
- **Parking costs** are:
 - First 30 minutes: **Free**
 - 0.5-3 hours: **\$10**
 - 3-8 hours: **\$15**
 - 8+ hours: **\$30**

During Your Visit

- **Plan to use the restroom** at Aspen Highlands or at the Maroon Bells day-use parking lot, located down from the shuttle drop-off. The bathrooms located at the shuttle drop-off are **closed** for the 2020 season.
- **Be prepared for afternoon rains**. Keep your rain gear easily accessible. Identify sheltered areas where you can stay dry when you arrive. Because shuttle delays are possible when it rains, bring warm clothes in addition to your rain gear.
- **Watch the time**. Plan to take a return shuttle back down **before** 3:00 PM if possible.

After Your Visit

- **Complete the survey** you receive via email about your experience. Your feedback is critical to maintaining the health and safety of visitors and improving overall visitor experience to the Maroon Bells.
