

# STAGE 2 FIRE RESTRICTIONS

ARE IN EFFECT FOR THE KAIBAB NATIONAL FOREST

THE FOLLOWING ARE PROHIBITED EVERYWHERE  
UNLESS SPECIFICALLY EXEMPTED:



1. **Fires, campfires, charcoal, coal and wood stoves** (except using a device that is solely fueled by liquid petroleum or LPG fuels that can be turned immediately on and off with no remaining burning material).



2. **Smoking** (except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site, or while stopped in an area at least 3 feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of any flammable material).



3. **Operating a chainsaw or other equipment powered by an internal combustion engine from the hours of 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.** (except generators with an approved spark-arresting device in an area that is barren or cleared of all overhead and surrounding flammable materials within at least 3 feet of the generator).



4. **Welding or operating an acetylene or other torch with open flame.**



5. **Using an explosive.** (Explosives are NEVER allowed on National Forest lands).



6. **Using fireworks.** (Fireworks are NEVER allowed on National Forest lands).

Under Stage 2 fire restrictions on the Kaibab National Forest, you may operate your motorized vehicle following the forest's standard travel management regulations. (Rules regarding motor vehicle use don't change under fire restrictions.) Be sure you refer to the Motor Vehicle Use Map for the area you are visiting, [bit.ly/KNFmaps](https://bit.ly/KNFmaps).

When you park your motorized vehicle off of any forest road, ensure that the area is barren or cleared of all overhead and surrounding flammable materials within 3 feet of the vehicle.

The National Forests use fire restrictions to help prevent unwanted, human-caused fires and to limit the exposure of visitors and residents during periods of potentially dangerous fire conditions.
