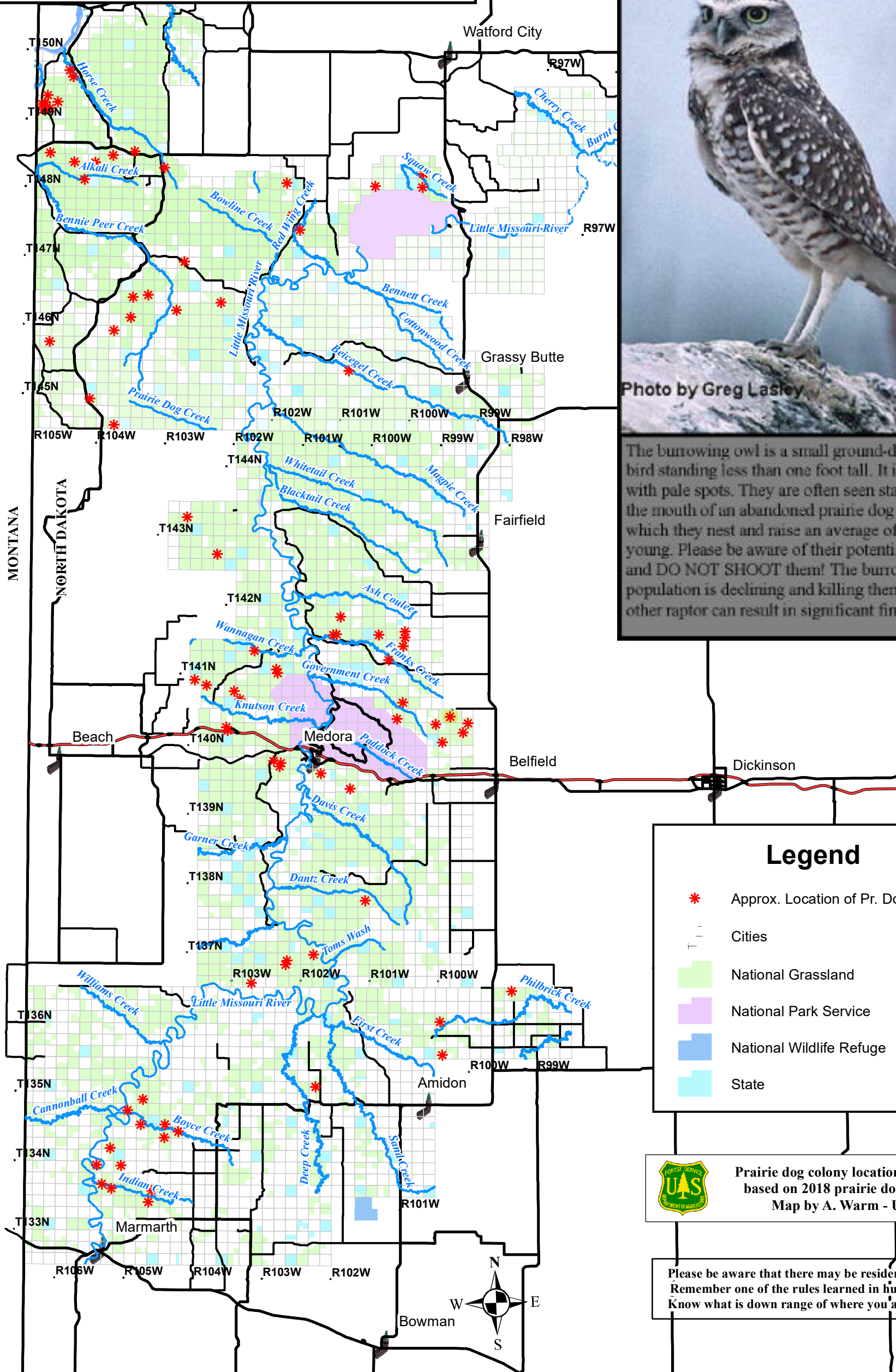


Prairie Dog Locations on the Little Missouri National Grasslands

The burrowing owl is a small ground-dwelling bird standing less than one foot tall. It is brown with pale spots. They are often seen standing at the mouth of an abandoned prairie dog burrow, in which they nest and raise an average of 7-9 young. Please be aware of their potential presence and **DO NOT SHOOT** them! The burrowing owl population is declining and killing them or any other raptor can result in significant fines.
