**Plumas National Forest Forest Order No. 05-11-03-20-09
Feather Falls Road, Trail, Overlook Platform and Trailhead Parking Lot Closure**

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), and to provide for public safety, the following acts are prohibited within the Plumas National Forest. This Order is effective from July 6, 2020, through August 31, 2020.

1. Being on Forest Road No. 21N35Y (Feather Falls Road) from milepost 0.0, at its intersection with Butte County Road 27672, continuing north 1.61 miles to its terminus at the Feather Falls Trailhead Parking Lot, as shown on the attached map.
36 CFR 261.54(e).
2. Being on Forest Trail No. 6E33 (Feather Falls Trail) from milepost 0.0, at its intersection with the Feather Falls Trailhead parking lot, continuing north to milepost 4.5, at the Feather Falls Trail Overlook Platform, as shown on the attached map.
36 CFR 261.55(a).
3. Entering or using the following Developed Recreation Sites, as shown on the attached map.
 - a. Feather Falls Trailhead Parking Lot
 - b. Feather Falls Trail Overlook Platform36 CFR 261.58(b).

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with Forest Service Permit No. FS-7700-48 (Permit for Use of Roads, Trails, or Areas Restricted by Regulation or Order), specifically exempting them from this Order.
2. Persons with a contract from the Forest Service authorizing work on the closed road, trail and area, to the extent authorized by the contract.
3. Any Federal, State, or local officer or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions found in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571 and 3581.
