

ORDER NO. 05-04-50-20-12
OCCUPANCY USE
INYO NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(a), and to protect natural resources, the following acts are prohibited within the Inyo National Forest. This Order is effective from July 3, 2020 through July 3, 2021.

1. Camping, as described below. 36 CFR 261.58(a).
 - a. In a developed campground for a period longer than specified in Exhibit A.
 - b. In an undeveloped location for a period longer than 14 consecutive days.
 - c. Anywhere within the Inyo NF for more than 28 total days during a calendar year.
2. Camping within an Inyo National Forest Recreation Restriction Area, except within the campsites located in developed campgrounds or in the posted overflow areas. 36 CFR 261.58(e).
3. Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire within an Inyo National Forest Recreation Restriction Area, except within the facilities provided for that purpose in a Developed Recreation Site. 36 CFR 261.58(a).
4. Possessing or storing any food or refuse within a Developed Recreation Site in a manner that allows bears or other wildlife to gain access. 36 CFR 261.58(cc).
5. Occupying an individual campsite with more than six people or a group campsite with more than the posted group size limit. 36 CFR 261.58(f).
6. Possessing, parking or leaving more than two vehicles, except motorcycles or bicycles, per camp unit within a Developed Recreation Site. 36 CFR 261.58(i).
7. Parking or leaving a vehicle in violation of posted instructions within a Developed Recreation Site. 36 CFR 261.58(g).


Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a permit from the forest service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571, and 3581.
