



## Trails ‘Logged Out’ Throughout Colville National Forest

### Trail Update 07/20/2020

Current recreation conditions available at <https://bit.ly/cnf-rec>.

- **Self-reliance is critical.** Visitors should come prepared for changing conditions and with everything needed to be safe, such as a map, sun screen, extra water, toilet paper, garbage bags, soap, hand sanitizer, etc. Information on the 10 Essentials is available at <https://bit.ly/wta-10e>.
- **All trailheads across the Colville National Forest** that are snow free are available for the public to use for parking and to access our trail systems.
- **If trailheads or trails are crowded**, consider visiting a less crowded area.
- **Trail registers will not be available** for public use to reduce potential transmission of coronavirus from one visitor to the next.
- **[Store food and garbage properly.](#)**
- **Pack out all trash, food scraps, and human waste**, if trash cans or restrooms are not available.
- **Do NOT bury feces** in developed recreation areas or within 200 feet of water! Bury feces at least 6-inches deep and pack out soiled toilet paper.
- **Visitors should wear masks and maintain physical distancing** when recreating in crowded areas of the forest.
- **No more than 10 people may gather together** based on the requirements in Phase 3 of the State’s Safe Start plan relating to outdoor recreation.

**Toilets, Garbage Service:** All trailhead and interpretive area toilet facilities across the forest will not be serviced until further notice as we do not have the required PPE or staff to safely clean and operate these facilities at this time. Toilets in campgrounds are being serviced, but our facilities will only be as clean as the last person who used them and we cannot guarantee a coronavirus-free environment.

**Fees:** No fees are charged to access trails or trailheads on the Colville National Forest. The only pay-to-park area is the Bead Lake Boat Launch, which is for boaters only. Hikers should park ¼ mile up the Bead Ridge Road (NFS Road 3215). Parking is free and provides access to the Bead Lake #127 Trail. Citations will be issued to any illegally parked vehicles and for non-payment of fees.

**Logging out:** This term refers to trail crews clearing a trail of obstacles by removing “blow down,” trail jargon for trees that have fallen across trails or other recreation areas under winter snow loads or during spring storms.
