Firewood Restrictions: Any firewood brought onto National Forest System land must meet one of the following requirements to reduce the spread of pests and pathogens that harm the forest ecosystem:

- 1. It is kiln-dried scrap lumber with no bark.
- 2. It is from your home or other Indiana location and has all bark removed.
- 3. It has an Indiana DNR compliance stamp.

Tipsaw Lake Recreation Area



Tipsaw Lake Recreation Area is located six miles south of Interstate 64, off of Indiana 37. It offers opportunities for both overnight and day use, with three camping loops, two group camping areas, a picnic area with two shelters available for reservation, a beach with modern bathhouse, Tipsaw Lake, which offers paddling, fishing, and boating (electric motors only) opportunities, and a 5.9 mile trail around the lake for hiking and biking. A boat launch with large parking area is provided. This area is operated by a concessionaire under a special use permit issued by the Forest Service from mid-April through late October.

Camping: There are three camping loops, Dogwood, Jackpine, and Catbrier, which provide a total of 48 campsites, including seven double sites. Regular sites can accommodate two vehicles and up to eight people, with an additional fee for more than one vehicle. Double sites can accommodate four vehicles and up to 16 people, with an additional fee for more than two vehicles. Within Dogwood and Jackpine camping loops there is a mix of electric and nonelectric sites as well as walk-in sites. There is centralized water, toilet/shower buildings with flush toilets and hot showers, and vault toilets. Catbrier Loop provides full RV hookups with 50 amp electrical service. Goldenrod Group Site offers space for 35 persons and has one 30 amp electric pedestal. Primrose Group Site offers space for up to 30 persons. There is one shared vault toilet between the two group sites. A dump station is located across the highway from the entrance to Tipsaw Lake Recreation Area. Campsites MUST be occupied the first night and may not be left unattended more than 24 hours. The campground is open April 15 through Oct. 15.

America the Beautiful Senior and Access Pass discounts may be available for pass holders. Pass discounts do not apply to amenities such as electricity. Day Use: There are many day use opportunities available here including: picnicking, boating, fishing, paddling, biking, and hiking. Picnic tables are provided at the beach and boat launch. The boat launch provides ample parking and a courtesy dock. Vault toilets are provided throughout the picnic area and at the boat launch. The picnic area also provides two shelter-houses, one of which has electricity and both of which are available for reservation, horseshoe pits and large grass area for games. The beach area offers a playground and modern bathhouse and is open Memorial Day through Labor Day. No pets or glass are allowed at the beach. The recreation area also serves as the trailhead for the Tipsaw Trail which is 5.9 miles in length and encircles Tipsaw Lake, offering both hiking and mountain biking opportunities. Mountain bikers (age 17 and older) are required to have a permit and stay on designated trails. Permits are available at forest offices and local vendors (see website). Forest trails are closed to all motorized vehicles.


A day use fee per vehicle is required between April 15 and Oct. 15, unless an overnight fee has been paid.
