

ORDER NO. 14-20-06
SPRINGS FIRE CLOSURE
SHASTA-TRINITY NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), and to provide for public safety, the following acts are prohibited within the Shasta-Trinity National Forest. This Order is effective from August 23, 2020, until the Springs Fire is declared out.

1. Going into or being upon National Forest System lands within the Springs Fire Closure Area. The Springs Fire Closure Area boundary begins at the intersection of USFS land boundary and Forest road No. 30N01 (Browns Creek) (Section 23, Township 30N, Range 10W, MDM), then continues north along western edge of Forest road No. 30N01 (Browns Creek) to its intersection with eastern edge of Forest road No. 30N02 (Fox Gulch) (Section 7, Township 30N, Range 9W, MDM), then continues south along the eastern edge of Forest road No. 30N02 (Fox Gulch) to its intersection of Forest road No. 31N02 (County Line FA02) (Section 18, Township 30N, Range 9W, MDM), then continues south along the eastern edge of Forest road No. 31N02 (County Line FA02) to its intersection with USFS land boundary (Section 26, Township 30N, Range 10W, MDM), then continues west along southern edge of USFS boundary to back to the starting point, as shown on the attached map. 36 C.F.R. 261.52(e).
2. Being on a portion of Forest Road No. 31N02 within the Shasta-Trinity National Forest, South Fork Management Unit beginning at mile post 8.0 of Forest Road No. 31N02 (County Line FA02) Section 17, Township 30N, Range 9W, MDM and continuing southwest 2.71 miles along Forest Road No. 31N02 (County Line FA02) to Section 18, Township 30N, Range 9W, MDM, pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b).
3. Being on any National Forest System road within the Springs Fire Closure Area, as shown on the attached map. 36 CFR 261.54(e).
4. Being on any National Forest System trail within the Springs Fire Closure Area, as shown on the attached map. 36 CFR 261.55(a).

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571, and 3581.
