# Malheur National Forest Campground Guide

### General Information

**All camping is first-come, first-served.** Magone Lake Group Camp is the only reservable campsite. Campgrounds are open from **May 1 - October 31**.

**Amenities**

Each developed campground has the following:

- Numbered sites
- Fire rings
- Picnic tables
- Toilet facilities
- Access roads

Some campgrounds may also have drinking water. Campgrounds do **NOT** have the following:

- Shower facilities
- RV holding tank dump stations (Stations are available at some local RV parks.)
- Trash service (Please take your trash with you and leave your site cleaner than you found it.)

**Camping Limits**

- Camping is limited to 14 days in developed campgrounds, 30 days in dispersed sites, and 45 days total per year on the forest.
- Only one RV, two vehicles (second incurs a fee), four motorcycles, or 5 bicycles per campsite.

### Rules and Regulations

Stay safe, preserve our forest, and be respectful of others by following these rules:

- Keep all pets leashed when in developed areas, like campgrounds and picnic areas.
- Fire restrictions may be in place during your stay. Check for the most updated information.
- Gathering personal use firewood is allowed while camping, but please do not cut or remove any live trees.
- Archaeological sites are precious and irreplaceable. Please leave them for future visitors to enjoy.


