

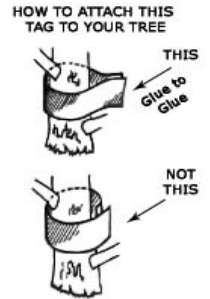
# SHASTA-TRINITY NATIONAL FOREST

## Christmas Tree Cutting Information – 2020

Some of the major conditions and prohibitions are listed below. Requirements are on the Shasta-Trinity Christmas Tree Permit and Cutting Maps. Motor Vehicle Use Maps (MVUM) show roads open to vehicular travel. Maps are made a part of the Christmas tree permit and will be enforced.

### Conditions of Permit...

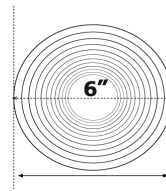
- Forest Service Permit (tag) must be signed by the permittee to be valid.
- Forest Service Permit (tag) must be attached to the main stem between the limbs and sealed in such a way that it must be broken to be removed from the tree.
- Forest Service Permit (tag) must remain on the tree and be visible at all times while in transit.
- Recreation.gov permit is to be placed on the dashboard of vehicle transporting the tree and visible through the windshield.
- Permit shall be in possession when harvesting and must be presented to any Peace or Forest Service Officer upon demand.
- Shasta-Trinity NF Christmas Tree Cutting Map is part of the permit. Permit and map must be in possession when cutting and transporting a Christmas tree.
- Motor Vehicle Use Maps indicate roads open to vehicular travel on the Forest, be sure you are familiar with roads open to vehicle travel on the forest. Maps are available from local offices and on the Shasta-Trinity website.
- Permit sale is final – No refund.



### PROHIBITED...

- Please be respectful of private property located within the Forest boundary. No cutting on private property is allowed. If you are unsure do not cut.
- See Restrictions on the Christmas tree cutting map and permit.
- Cutting any tree in a plantation unit is prohibited on the Shasta side of the Forest.
- When cutting in the Weaverville area, do not cut the Giant Sequoia trees located at Slate Creek, Tannery Gulch Campground, Mule Creek Station and on Guy Covington Road. These trees were planted for roadside beautification in the early 1960's.

- Cutting or removing any tree with a main stem exceeding 6 inches in diameter measured at ground level.



Use the ruler to measure the distance **ACROSS** the trunk of your tree at ground level.



- Stump heights greater than 12 inches and any live branches remaining on the stump.
- Cutting a tree on private land.
- Cutting a tree within 100 feet of the outer edge of a designated road or 100 feet developed recreation area, campsite or day use facility.
