

FOREST ORDER NO. 05 07 57 20 21
LOS PADRES NATIONAL FOREST
DRY CANYON AREA, ROAD, AND TRAIL CLOSURE

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(a) and (b), and to provide for public safety and protect natural resources, the following acts are prohibited within the Mt. Pinos Ranger District of the Los Padres National Forest. This Order is effective from October 24, 2020 through October 23, 2021.

1. Going into or being upon National Forest System lands within the Dry Canyon Closure Area. The Dry Canyon Closure Area Boundary begins at a point 100 feet due north of the intersection of the Dry Canyon/Sulphur Springs Canyon Divide and Lockwood Valley Road and continues north following the Dry Canyon/Sulphur Springs Canyon Divide to its intersection with Dry Canyon/Apache Canyon Divide., then continues east following the Dry Canyon/Apache Canyon Divide to its intersection with the eastern boundary of Section 16, Township (T) 8 North (N), Range (R) 22 West, San Bernardino Base and Meridian (SBBM) (27th Principal Meridian (PM)), then continues south following the eastern boundaries of Sections 16, 21 and 28, T8N, R22W, SBBM (27th PM), then continues west following the southern boundary of Section 28 T8N, R22W SBBM (27th PM), then continues south following the eastern boundary of Section 32, T8N, R22W, SBBM (27th PM), then continues west following the southern boundary of Section 32, T8N, R22W, SBBM (27th PM), then continues south following the eastern boundaries of Sections 6 and 7, T7N, R 22W, SBBM (27th PM), to a point 100 feet north of the Lockwood Valley Road, then continues parallel and along Lockwood Valley Road at a distance of 100 feet north to its intersection with the private property boundary in Section 7, T7N, R22W, SBBM (27th PM) and Section 12, T7N, R23W, SBBM (27th PM), then continues west and south following the private property boundary to a point 100 feet north of Lockwood Valley Road, then continues west parallel to Lockwood Valley Road at a distance of 100 feet back to the starting point. 36 C.F.R. § 261.53(e).
2. Being on any National Forest System road within the Dry Canyon Closure Area, as shown on the attached map. 36 C.F.R. § 261.54(e).
3. Being on any National Forest System trail within the Dry Canyon Closure Area, as shown on the attached map. 36 C.F.R. § 261.55(a).

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

Any Federal, State, or local law enforcement officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 C.F.R. Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C. §§ 3559, 3571, and 3581.
