

FOREST ORDER NO. 0513-20-40

SEQUOIA NATIONAL FOREST
GIANT SEQUOIA NATIONAL MONUMENT
HUME LAKE RANGER DISTRICT

NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM ROADS

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 36 C.F.R. § 261.50 (b), and to provide public safety and to protect natural resources, the following act is prohibited within the Hume Lake Ranger District of the Sequoia National Forest. This Order is in effect from November 18, 2020 through May 30, 2021.

Using any type of motorized wheeled vehicle on the National Forest System roads listed below and shown on the attached map. This prohibition does not apply to the use of tracked-over-the-snow vehicles when there is a minimum of 12 inches of snow on the road. A tracked-over-the-snow vehicle is defined as any vehicle propelled and/or steered by cleated belts or tracks. For purposes of this Order, a wheelchair is not considered to be a motorized wheeled vehicle.

- a. Millwood Road (Forest Road No. 13S97) from a point 0.5 miles east of its intersection with Davis Road (Forest Road No. 12S01) then east to mile point 5.0;
- b. Burton Road (Forest Road no. 14S02);
- c. Big Meadows Horse Corral Road (Forest Road No. 14S11) from a point 0.2 miles north of its intersection with Generals Highway then northeast 12.4 miles to Summit Meadow;
- d. Woodward Road (Forest Road No. 14S18);
- e. Chimney Rock Road (Forest Road No. 14S29) from a point 3.4 miles south of its intersection with Generals Highway then east 0.8 miles to Beartrap Meadow Road (Forest Road No. 14S56);
- f. Rock Road (Forest Road No. 14S14);
- g. Chicago Stump Road (Forest Road No. 13S03); and
- h. Converse Mountain Road (Forest Road No. 13S55);

36 C.F.R. § 261.54(a).

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with Forest Service Permit No. FS-7700-48 (Permit for Use of Roads, Trails, or Areas Restricted by Regulation or Order), specifically exempting them from this Order.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

This prohibition is in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 C.F.R. Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of this prohibition is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C. §§ 3559, 3571, and 3581.
