FOREST ORDER  
East Troublesome Fire**

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on National Forest System (NFS) lands, roads, and trails within the Sulphur Ranger District of the Arapaho National Forest, Grand County, Colorado described below and shown on the attached map incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A (the “Restricted Areas,” “Restricted Roads,” and “Restricted Trails”). The purpose of this Order is to protect public safety on the areas, roads, and trails affected by the 2020 East Troublesome Fire and during post-fire restoration operations and activities.

**RESTRICTED AREAS, ROADS, AND TRAILS:**

Restricted Areas:

- The NFS lands within 1/4 mile on either side of Colorado State Highway 125 (the “Highway 125 Corridor”).

Restricted Roads:

- The NFS Roads as shown on Exhibit A and described on Exhibit B.

Restricted Trails:

- The NFS Trails as shown on Exhibit A and described on Exhibit B.

**PROHIBITIONS:**

- 1. Being on the Restricted Roads. 36 CFR 261.54(e)**
- 2. Being on the Restricted Trails. 36 CFR 261.55(a)**
- 3. Camping in the Highway 125 Corridor. 36 CFR 261.58(e)**

**EXEMPTIONS:**

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
2. Persons with a special use authorization or other Forest Service authorization specifically exempting them from this Order.
3. Persons with valid recreation residence permits who have coordinated with the permit administrator for exemption from this Order.
4. Authorized Federal, State, local, contractor, and subcontractor personnel implementing post-fire recovery projects and associated activities within the Restricted Areas, Roads, and Trails.

This Order supersedes, rescinds, and replaces Order #ARP-SRD-2021-12 dated September 17, 2021.

This Order becomes effective when signed and shall remain in effect until November 15, 2021 or until rescinded.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. (16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C. §§ 3559, 3571, 3581).
