ORDER NO. 06-05-21-02

Pursuant to 16 USC § 551 and 36 CFR § 261.50 (a) (b), the following acts are prohibited upon the Forest Service Roads (FSR) 63, and a portion of 6320, located within the Skykomish Ranger District of the Mt. Baker-Snoqualmie National Forest as described below and shown in Exhibit A. This Order will be effective beginning April 5, 2021 and ending April 4, 2023.

PROHIBITION:

1. **Entering into or being upon area closed for the protection of public health or safety, as shown on the attached map, as described in this order.** [36 CFR § 261.53(e)]
2. **Being on the road.** [36 CFR § 261.54(e)]

Area is closed on portions of National Forest System Lands in N1/2 NE1/4 Section 2, T.27 N., R. 10 E.; and S1/2 SE1/4 Section 35, SW1/4 Section 36, T. 28 N., R. 10 E., W.M.; for a width of 150 yards on either side of the centerline of FSR 63, from Milepost 6.09 to Milepost 7.02, and FSR 6320, from Milepost 0.00 to Milepost 0.27, and encompassing the entire construction zone, including the new road right-of-way, removal of the damaged right of way, temporary access roads, and material and equipment staging areas for the Snohomish County Index-Galena Road Relocation project. 
EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of any organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

This prohibition is in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 C.F.R. Part 261, Subpart A.

Violations of this prohibition are punishable as a Class B Misdemeanor, by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both (16 USC § 551; 18 USC § 3559 and 18 USC § 3571).
