

**FOREST ORDER NUMBER 05-07-51-21-10**  
LOS PADRES NATIONAL FOREST  
MONTEREY RANGER DISTRICT  
WILLOW FIRE AREA TRAIL AND CAMPGROUND CLOSURE

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(a) and (b), and to provide for public safety, the following acts are prohibited within the Monterey Ranger District of the Los Padres National Forest. This Order is effective from July 24, 2021, through January 24, 2022.

1. Being on the following National Forest System Trails, as shown on the attached map:
  - a. Forest Trail 4E07 (Marble Peak Trail) from its intersection with Forest Trail 3E09 (South Fork Trail) in the Southeast (SE)  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 11, Township 20 South, Range 3 East for approximately 7.5 miles to its intersection with Forest Trail 4E05 (Horse Pasture Trail) in the SE  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 3, Township 20 South, Range 4 East, as shown on the attached map. (All locations associated with Mount Diablo Base Meridian – MDBM)
  - b. Forest Trail 4E06 (Tony Trail) from its beginning terminus at Forest Trail 4E07 (Marble Peak Trail) in the Northwest (NW)  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 8, Township 20 South, Range 4 East for approximately 3.4 miles to its ending terminus at Forest Road 18S02 (Tassajara Road) in the SE  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 32, Township 19 South, Range 4 East.

2. Entering or using the following campgrounds:
  - a. Tassajara Creek Camp, located in the SE  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 4, Township 20 South, Range 4 East, as shown on the attached map.
  - b. Willow Springs Camp, located in the NW  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 8, Township 20 South, Range 4 East, as shown on the attached map.

36 C.F.R. § 261.58(b).

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Any Federal, State or Local Officer or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
2. Persons with a U.S. Forest Service contract, special use permit, or partnership agreement authorizing work on the closed trails or closed recreation sites, and their employees, sub-contractors, and agents, are exempt from the prohibitions listed above to the extent necessary to perform the authorized work.

3. Persons with Forest Service Permit No. FS-7700-48 (Permit for Use of Roads, Trails, or Areas Restricted by Regulation or Order), specifically exempting them from this Order.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 C.F.R. Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for and individual or \$10,000 for an organization or imprisonment for not more than six months or both. 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C. §§ 3559, 3571 and 3581.
