

**SHASTA-TRINITY NATIONAL FOREST
FOREST ORDER NO. 14-21-32
SALT FIRE CLOSURE**

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(a) and (b), and to provide for public safety, the following acts are prohibited within the Shasta-Trinity National Forest. This Order is effective from September 23, 2021, through April 15, 2022.

1. Going into or being upon any National Forest System lands within the Salt Fire Closure Area, as described in Exhibit A and shown on the attached map. 36 C.F.R. § 261.52(e).
2. Being on any National Forest system road within the Salt Fire Closure Area, as described in Exhibit A and shown on the attached map. 36 C.F.R. § 261.54(e).

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Owners or lessees of land in the Salt Fire Closure Area, to the extent necessary to access their land.
2. Residents of the Salt Fire Closure Area, to the extent necessary to access their residences.
3. Persons with Forest Service Permit No. FS-7700-48 (Permit for Use of Roads, Trails, or Areas Restricted by Regulation or Order), specifically exempting them from this Order.
4. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire-fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
5. Persons engaged in a business, trade, or occupation are not exempt from the prohibitions listed above but may use National Forest System roads to the extent necessary to carry out their business, trade, or occupation.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 C.F.R. Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C. §§ 3559, 3571, and 3581.

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Exhibit A

Prohibition 1:

The Salt Fire Closure Area boundary begins at the intersection of Gregory Creek Road (Forest Road 35N15) and Interstate Highway 5 (I-5) (Section 19, Township 35N, Range 4W, Mount Diablo Meridian (MDM)), then continues north along the east edge of I-5 to the intersection with Shasta Lake at Antlers Bridge (Section 24, Township 35N, Range 5W, MDM), then continues north along the east shoreline of Shasta Lake to the boundary line between Section 6 and Section 7 (Township 35N, Range 4W, MDM), then continues east along the section line boundary between Section 6 and Section 7 to the National Recreation Area Boundary (Township 35N, Range 4W, MDM), then continues south through Section 7 to the Section line boundary between Section 7 and Section 18 (Township 35N, Range 4W, MDM), then continues east along the boundary between Section 7 and Section 18 to the east boundary of Section 18 then continues south along the east boundary of Section 18, Section 19 and Section 30 (Township 35N, Range 4W, MDM) to the intersection with I-5, then continues north along the east edge of I-5 back to the starting point, as shown on the attached map.

Prohibition 2:

The following National Forest System roads are closed within the Salt Fire Closure Area:

35N15 - Gregory Creek Road

35N15B - Gregory Beach Road

35N15A - Gregory Campground Road
