

Huron-Manistee National Forests
Mio Ranger District Special Uses Projects

The Huron-Manistee National Forests, have received requests for continued year-round commercial use and maintenance of existing Forest Service Roads (FSR) to access oil and gas well sites on the Mio Ranger District. All roads would be maintained at level 2-3, encouraging high clearance to passenger vehicles. Maintenance would include grading, cleaning lead-out ditches, spot graveling, brushing vegetation, and snowplowing. If allowed, the decision would be implemented by issuing a new 20-year special use permit for the road, use, and maintenance. The following are the roads requested.

1. FSR 4241, a portion located in NW $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 33, T25N, RE, Mentor Township, Oscoda County, Michigan. The area requested is from Hughes Lake Road, a county maintained road to the "C", 1-33 well site, approximately 2,500 feet x 30 feet wide or 1.72 acres.
2. FSR 4314, the portion located in SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 29 and NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 32, T25N, R3E, Mentor Township, Oscoda County, Michigan. The road requested is from Hughes Lake Road, a county maintained road to the "C", 1-32 well site, approximately 794 feet x 30 feet wide or 0.55 acre.
