If you chose

- a) Add a striped purple wedge—tossing them in the fire grate attracts animals and leaves a mess for the next visitors.
- b) or c) Add a solid purple wedge—carrying them out or eating them leaves no trace of your visit.

What should you do when you reach the end of a portage and remember that you left your plastic water bottle at the previous portage?

- a) Go back and get it.
- b) Leave it for another group to find and use.

If you chose

- a) Add a solid purple wedge—retrieving it takes time but you leave no trace of your visit.
