Introduction

This report provides background information for the Species Diversity and Species Risk Assessment portions of the Ecological Sustainability Report included under the current Forest Plan Revision. It identifies federally threatened and endangered species, species of concern, and species of interest whose ranges include the forest plan area (FSH 1909.12, Chap. 40, Sec. 43.2). The primary intent of this report is to document the methods used in evaluating species for the revision process. It describes the chronology and process of developing of the proposed species list for those species requiring additional consideration in the plan revision process, and the subsequent identification of potential threats to those species. The species list and majority of species information is located in a separate Microsoft-ACCESS database. This database includes species-specific data used in the evaluation process, and is meant to function as a “living document” that is subject to change as new information becomes available.

Ecological sustainability is recognized as one of the primary components under the current planning rule, and providing for ecosystem diversity is an integral component of this process. Ecological conditions that provide for ecosystem diversity are the context for the evaluation of species diversity (FSH 1909.12, Chap. 40, Sec. 43.21). Plan components for ecosystem diversity may contribute to ecological conditions that may or may not support species diversity. Therefore, the Species Diversity Analysis Process, in conjunction with the Ecosystem Diversity Analysis Process, strives to promote ecological sustainability across the planning area by developing Forest Plan components that protect or enhance species diversity where existing plan direction does not sufficiently protect or enhance individual species, groups of species, or habitats (FSH 1909.12, Ch. 40; FSM 1921.74b and 1921.77c).

PART I: Species Diversity

Species List

The Species Diversity Analysis Process considers the relationships between ecosystem diversity components and select plant and animal species (and subspecies) in the plan area by using explicit criteria to identify species considered to be of concern or interest in the plan area. Development of the proposed species list followed national direction (FSH 1909.12, Ch 40, Sec 43. 22). The list consisted of Threatened and Endangered (T & E) species for Region 3; Species-of-Concern (SOC) and potential Species-of-Interest (SOI) that occur within the forest plan area. This list of select species serves as a model of species diversity in the planning area. The list was developed only for Forest Plan revision purposes, and does not confer special regulatory status on any species beyond existing state and federal status.

An iterative approach was used to develop the proposed species list. Biologists and botanists from the Kaibab, Coconino, Prescott, and Apache-Sitgreaves National Forests gathered initial species information, and incorporated input from a Species Diversity focus group. The focus group consisted of representatives from the Forest Service, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS), Arizona Game and Fish Department (AGFD), Grand Canyon Wildlands Council, National Park Service, Nature Conservancy, and others. The State Heritage Data Management System and Arizona Rare Plant Task Force were contracted for plant information. The Forest

Service Southwestern Regional Office and five Arizona Forests contracted with the Museum of Northern Arizona for information regarding invertebrate species. An initial list of species and subspecies (including plants, macro-lichens, invertebrates, reptiles, amphibians, birds, and mammals) with population or habitat concerns in Arizona was developed using the following criteria.

Criteria

The following guidelines were used for species inclusion on the initial list and stratification purposes. These guidelines were set forth by the Ecological Sustainability workgroup (USDA Forest Service 2008). NatureServe (www.natureserve.org) maintains ranking information for SOC and SOI (NatureServe 2008).

Threatened and Endangered Species

The FWS maintains lists for Threatened and Endangered species federally listed under the Endangered Species Act (1973). This list is periodically reviewed, and can be found at www.fws.gov/endangered/. Lists by Arizona county can be found at www.fws.gov/arizonaes/.

- Include T & E species known or likely to occur on the forest
- Accidental occurrences of species on the planning unit may not warrant inclusion under plan revision.
- If a species historically occurred on the forest, but has no known recent occurrences and no expectation for reestablishment it may not warrant inclusion under plan revision.

Species of Concern (FSH 1909.12.40.43.22b)

Species of Concern are those species for which the Forest Supervisor may determine that management actions may be necessary to prevent future listing under the Endangered Species Act.

- Proposed and candidate species under the Endangered Species Act (ESA).
- Species ranked G-1, G-2, and G-3 by NatureServe.
- Subspecific taxa ranked T-1, T-2, and T-3 by NatureServe.
- Species petitioned for federal listing and for which a positive “90 day finding” has been made.
- Species delisted within the last 5 years and/or delisted species which require continued monitoring.

Potential Species of Interest (FSH 1909.12.40.43.22c)

Species of Interest are those species for which the Forest Supervisor may determine that management actions may be necessary or desirable to achieve ecological or other multiple use objectives. Designation of SOI may be influenced by local conditions, and site specific management actions and/or habitat conditions which might impart further risk to the species. In addition socio-economic value, public interest, and threats to ecosystem diversity may be considered.

- Species with ranks of S-1, S-2, N-1, or N-2 on the NatureServe
- State listed T & E
- Species of conservation concern as identified by the State Comprehensive Wildlife Strategy.

- Species on the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service Birds of Conservation Concern National Priority List.
- Additional species of regional or local conservation concern
- Species hunted or fished
- Other species of public interest

Since many of the potential SOI species were not at significant local risk, or of high public interest, it was necessary to use additional criteria to determine those that merit identification as SOI:

- Species habitat or population has declined significantly in the plan area.
- Species and its habitats are not well-distributed in the plan area.
- Species population numbers are low in the plan area.
- Species is dependent on a specialized habitat or one that is limited in the plan area.
- There is some imminent threat to the species.
- Species habitat or population is not generally secure in the planning area, and NFS lands act as an important refuge.
- Species is of public interest, including those species identified cooperatively with State Fish and Wildlife Agencies consistent with the Sikes Act.
- Species is invasive.
- Species poses a threat to ecosystem or species diversity.

Assessment Sources

Sources of information included, but were not limited to:

- The Southwestern Regional Forester Sensitive Species List
- Feedback from a Species Diversity Workgroup
- Biota Information System of New Mexico (Bison-M)
- Arizona State Heritage Data Management System
- Arizona Rare Plant Task Force
- Museum of Northern Arizona
- Taxonomy books, field guides, journals, various publications
- On-line herbaria,
- Species listed or ranked within various strategies, agreements and lists such as, Arizona Partners in Flight, Partners in Flight, the Comprehensive Wildlife Conservation Strategy, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Birds of Conservation Concern, Statewide Conservation Agreement for native fish, Western Bat Working Group priorities, Arizona's administrative rules and laws
- Local, regional or national experts for various species taxa

The FWS and the AGFD were additionally contacted regarding information about future plans to supplement, introduce or re-introduce species on or adjacent to the Kaibab National Forest within the next 5-10 years. Appendix A provides additional information on some of the primary resources consulted during the screening process.

Screening Results

If the resulting SOC and SOI from this initial list met any of the following criteria they were removed from the list for further consideration in the planning process (FSH 1909.12, CH 40, Sec. 43.22d):

- Species does not occur on the forest and there is no known habitat in the plan area.
- Species is secure in the plan area based on occurrence, distribution, available habitat, and response to natural disturbance and/or management.
- There is too little information to complete a reliable assessment (taxonomic uncertainty, habitat needs, population trend estimates).
- Species are not affected by any form of current or potential management or lack of management in the plan area.

The initial list contained a total of 1,835 species (Appendix B). The subsequent screening resulted in a list of 145 species to be carried forward in the Species Diversity Analysis Process (Table 1). This included 63 invertebrate and vertebrates (26 birds, 1 fish, 8 reptiles and amphibians, 9 invertebrates, 19 mammals) and 82 plants to be carried forward for further analysis. Of those species, 3 were federally threatened or endangered, 84 were SOC and the remaining 58 were SOI. Those species not carried forward were retained in the project record should future information become available that might warrant reconsideration at a later date. A total of 1,690 species were screened out. The majority (1,419) of those species was screened out because they did not occur in the planning unit, or there was insufficient information to complete a reliable assessment. Without adequate information on species habitat needs and/or population and status trends, it is difficult, if not impossible to devise adequate management policies. For many of these species additional research is necessary and encouraged. There were 50 species screened out because of taxonomic uncertainty. The remaining 221 species were screened out because they were secure in the planning unit or were unlikely to be affected by current management or lack of management. The initial list of species considered, and the screening rationale and results for each one is included in the ACCESS database.

Habitat Associations and Initial Species Groups

Two types of basic information were initially used to group species carried forward in the Species Diversity Analysis Process; terrestrial or aquatic habitat associations, and biotic or abiotic habitat components. Species were grouped first by habitat association, represented by water or the 15 broadly defined vegetation types historically present in the planning area (i.e., 'PNVT'; see discussion in following paragraph). Species were secondarily grouped by habitat components not specifically addressed by broad habitat associations. Finally, species not addressed in the two previous groups were addressed separately.

Vegetation is one of the primary factors which influences species diversity and abundance and is one of the more obvious habitat components subject to management, land use, and natural disturbance. Because vegetation is such a significant habitat component, and because integration of species with habitat components is a primary emphasis of the current ESR, species were

associated with one or more of several vegetation states that might be influenced by management activities on National Forest Service land. These Potential Natural Vegetation Types (PNVTs) represent the land's potential vegetation under natural disturbance or biological regimes, minus human induced change. Availability and status of PNVTs on the forest is in many cases directly tied to species presence and absence, and designation of particular PNVTs to specific species is critical for assessing future management needs. For the Southwest Region, PNVTs were developed collaboratively by The Nature Conservancy and the U.S. Forest Service's Mid-Scale Vegetation Mapping Project. It is not within the scope of this document to elaborate further on PNVTs, but they are discussed thoroughly in the KNF Vegetation Fire and Fuels Report (Kaibab National Forest 2008a).

Species associated with ecosystem diversity characteristics of terrestrial vegetation or aquatic systems




Figure 1. Proportion of species by category (SOI: Species of Interest, SOC: Species of Concern, ESA: species federally listed under the Endangered Species Act of 1973) and habitat type.

Table 2 shows the number of species by taxa and category and their habitat associations. A detailed listing by species can be found in Appendix C. Figure 1 represents the proportion of species in each category by habitat association. Numerous species were associated with more than one PNVT. However, only 3 species (Pale Townsend's big-eared bat, American peregrine falcon, and California condor), were so wide ranging among habitat types that they could not be assigned a particular habitat association.

Species grouped by specific habitat components

Plants were grouped solely on habitat associations (i.e., PNVT and Water). Non-plant species (specified in Table 4) were secondarily grouped by the following habitat components:

- **Trees:** cavities, snags, downed logs, litter/debris, tree species (i.e., Oak, Aspen), tree size class, tree height, sap producing hard woods.
- **Forest:** open/closed canopy, forest clearings, degree of canopy layering, tree dispersion (i.e., clumps and groups),
- **Understory:** available forage, low shrubs, ferns, grasses for nesting.
- **Shrubland:** shrub height and density, herbaceous component.
- **Wetland/Water:** cattle tanks, ephemeral pools, seeps, springs, emergent vegetation, marsh/wetland edges
- **Grassland:** subalpine meadows, moist meadows, open grasslands
- **Rock and Other Abiotic:** burrows, canyons, cliffs crevices, talus, mines, empty buildings

Other species

The California condor was the only species neither tied to a specific habitat in the plan area nor addressed by the habitat components specified above. For this species, food resources (i.e., carcasses) are the critical limiting factor.

PART II: Species Risk Assessment

Once the list of species to be carried forward for further analysis were identified, species were assigned to two groups: 1) species threatened by risks to ecosystem diversity characteristics, and 2) species facing threats in addition to risks to ecosystem diversity characteristics. Ecosystem diversity characteristics include the environmental measures that were used to describe terrestrial vegetation (PNVT), soil, and aquatic conditions on the Forest. Threats to composition, structure, and processes that affect vegetation, soil, and aquatic conditions were considered and described in relation to historic conditions. For details, refer to the Kaibab National Forest vegetation, fire and fuels report (Kaibab National Forest 2008a), soils report (Kaibab National Forest 2008b), and aquatic systems report (Kaibab National Forest 2008c).

Species Associated With Risks to Ecosystem Diversity Characteristics

Information gathered on each species was reviewed and a determination made as to whether the threats to the terrestrial and aquatic ecosystem diversity characteristics were also affecting the species. In general, it was assumed that those species associated with PNVTs or water sources departed from and trending away from historic conditions were at risk. Many species were associated with more than one PNVT. All PNVTs analyzed in the terrestrial vegetation report (Kaibab National Forest 2008a) were departed from reference conditions, suggesting that the associated species' habitat needs were not being met and therefore not sustainable given current management practices (Table 3). Water sources (seeps, springs, streams, ponds, reservoirs, tanks) exhibit various conditions by watershed. Most watersheds in the planning area show low departure from reference conditions, but some individual water sources are departed from reference conditions (Kaibab National Forest 2008c). Habitat-specific threats related to ecosystem diversity characteristics included effects such as fire, vegetation type conversion, overgrazing, insect outbreaks and exotic species invasion. These threats and their impacts on PNVTs are treated more intensively in the Kaibab National Forest vegetation, fire and fuels report (Kaibab National Forest 2008a). Threats associated with water can be found in the aquatic systems report (Kaibab National Forest 2008c), and fish species diversity report (Kaibab National Forest 2008d).

Species Facing Threats Not Associated With Risks to Ecosystem Diversity Characteristics




Figure 2. Total Species Affected By Additional Threats to Specific Habitat Features




Figure 3. Species facing additional threats not tied to habitat features

Additional management considerations may be necessary to adequately address threats that are not covered by landscape level management policies. If species had additional threats to their habitat which could not be accounted for by ecosystem diversity risks alone, those threats were categorized separately by related habitat features (Figure 2 and Table 4). This included species which might depend on non-vegetative features or fine-scale microhabitat components found within the broader context of their habitat. Finally, some species face threats that are not related to ecosystem diversity characteristics or habitat features, and they are identified in Table 5 and summarized in Figure 3. Appendix D describes specific identified threats.

Some species that occur on the Forest face an additional threat simply by virtue of their relatively limited range-wide distribution. These species might be easily affected by localized and/or stochastic events, and were noted separately regardless of whether or not they were associated with habitat level threats. A species (or subspecies) was considered to have a Restricted Distribution if it occurs to a limited extent in the Southwest; a species was also considered to be a Narrow Endemic if it has extremely limited distribution and/or habitat in northern Arizona. Due to their limited distribution and potential susceptibility to perturbation, these species may require additional management considerations. There were 73 species for which their restricted distribution was considered an additional threat. Of these, 47 were narrow endemics (Table 6).

Although we did not formally identify climate change as a specific risk to our list of potential species, we recognize that climate change exists and that future management actions may need to be re-evaluated as new data becomes available. In a recent review, Periman (2008), found that most current models of climate change are broad and still evolving, making it difficult to assess associated impacts at the forest level scale. This distinction is important if locally implemented management strategies are to be effective.

In general, most climate modelers agree that the Southwest is trending toward prolonged drought. Future potential ecological effects in the Southwest may include an increase in more intense disturbance events such as wildfires, monsoons, and wind. Changing ecological

conditions could provide opportunities for invasion by non-native species with potential subsequent negative impacts on various taxa. General trends toward decreased precipitation could limit overall forest productivity. General changes in vegetation patterns could affect overall distribution and range of flora as well as fauna. Cumulatively these factors would likely impact biodiversity, however to what extent is currently uncertain. (See Periman 2008 and references therein).

Summary of Major Findings and Conclusions

- 145 species were selected for further analysis from an initial list of 1,835 species.
- 142 species are subject to threats to Ecological Diversity Characteristics of terrestrial and aquatic systems.
- 96 species are subject to additional threats beyond identified threats to Ecological Diversity Characteristics of terrestrial and aquatic systems.
- 73 species with restricted distributions (including 47 narrow endemics) occur (or are likely to occur) wholly or in part within the planning area.

Of the 145 species identified as a model of species diversity on the KNF, 142 species are subject to factors that threaten terrestrial and aquatic ecosystem diversity characteristics. As the risks to ecosystem diversity characteristics mentioned above are managed, the species' habitat needs related to those ecosystem diversity characteristics will also be addressed. However, 96 species are subject to additional threats beyond identified risks to terrestrial and aquatic ecosystem diversity characteristics.

Some of these additional threats involve localized habitat features (Table 4). The risk of these threats must be considered at the project level to manage for and maintain full ecosystem function across the Forest. While plant and wildlife species use broad-scale vegetation types and associated developmental states in a general sense, most species use fine-scale habitat components in a specialized way. For example, many primary- and secondary cavity nesting species depend on an adequate distribution of standing dead wood suitable for excavation. The narrow endemic plant, Arizona bugbane, is highly dependent on cool, shady microsite conditions in ponderosa pine forest. These fine-scale habitat needs are not specifically considered or addressed in broad-scale terrestrial or aquatic management plans, so it is necessary to develop desired conditions and evaluate habitat needs from the species' perspective. Desired conditions can be described in the Forest Plan, but the best way to evaluate these fine-scale habitat issues is at the project level. By using both broad-scale and fine-scale approaches to land management planning, the Forest can promote sustainable management of fully-functioning ecosystems.

Other additional threats some species face are not related to specific habitat features (Table 5). Some of these threats are directly within the agency's control and authority to manage, such as avoiding Arizona sunflowers during weed eradication activities, and avoiding Western flame-flowers during slash-pile burning activities. Some threats are not so much within agency control, but the KNF has the authority to mitigate the threats. For example, biological threats like disease or cowbird parasitism may be addressed by modifying livestock use, or restricting access in areas of high risk. The impacts of development, infrastructure, and non-renewable resource

exploration/extraction activities may also be mitigated on a case-by-case basis. Desired conditions and acceptable mitigation strategies addressing threats not tied to habitat features can be described in the Forest Plan.

Species that may suffer especially severe consequences of unmanaged threats are the 73 “restricted distribution” plants and animals on the Forest (Table 6). In areas where these species occur, or are likely to occur, special consideration must be paid to analyzing and managing the risk of localized threats at the project level.

Finally, a key issue related to successfully effecting ecological change with land management planning is the concept of species and habitat monitoring. Species monitoring has been employed on the KNF to a limited extent (e.g., bird surveys), but could be used more extensively and with greater influence in designing future projects. Traditional forest and range monitoring are moderately applicable to habitat monitoring, but do not target wildlife and sensitive plant management objectives. The results of thoughtful monitoring efforts are important for adapting management activities to new conditions in the planning area. To determine if agency management activities meet species and habitat objectives, Plan components should be developed to better support species and habitat monitoring efforts on the Forest.

NatureServe uses a ranking system to establish conservation status of species at the Global (G), National (N), and Subnational (S) levels. Numerical numbers (1-5) are also assigned to the level appropriate for each species and are defined as follows:

1. Critically Imperiled
2. Imperiled
3. Vulnerable
4. Apparently Secure
5. Secure

APPENDIX D: Description of threats not associated with Ecosystem Diversity Characteristics.

- Inappropriate timber harvest: Some timber harvest practices can modify habitat components in the forest to a degree that the harvested area becomes unsuitable habitat for desired species.
- Collection/harvest: Collecting specimens for research or personal use, or harvesting legally hunted game species.
- Fragmentation: Habitat fragmentation can be caused by activities on land in other ownership, roads, fencing, and areas of concentrated use by people.
- Disease: One frog species is susceptible to a serious fungal disease that can be transmitted by human activities, bighorn sheep are susceptible to multiple diseases transmitted by domestic sheep and goats, and prairie dogs are susceptible to plague.
- Livestock grazing on aspen, wetland vegetation, and facilitation of nest parasitism: Inappropriate livestock use can alter or inhibit growth of woody and herbaceous plants, and facilitate the spread of brown-headed cowbird nest parasitism.
- Nonnative / Invasive species: Non-native species threaten native species through competition, predation, and hybridization.
- Ungulate herbivory: At high population densities, elk and mule deer herbivory can alter or inhibit growth of woody and herbaceous plants (e.g., aspen, cliffrose, grassland and wetland vegetation).
