

## **Help Preserve the Lookout**

**Mallard Peak Lookout was built in 1929 and is one of the last surviving prototype L-4 lookouts in the West. As such it is a priceless piece of Forest Service and United States history. The lookout was taken out of service in 1956. A major preservation project was completed in the early 1980s and we are in the process of trying to complete another series of restoration projects on it in the next several years. Please help us preserve it by following the simple rules outlined below:**

- ✓ **One or more shutters may be screwed shut; please leave those shutters closed so that we can finish restoration work on them.**
- ✓ **If a shutter is not screwed shut feel free to raise them, but when done please put them back down when you leave.**
- ✓ **Close the door and door shutter and secure them when you leave.**
- ✓ **Please leave any tools or restoration supplies where you find them.**
- ✓ **If you light a fire in the stove, please make sure it is out before you leave.**
