

Antelope Lake Recreation Area

Mt. Hough Ranger District



About the Area

At 5,000 feet in elevation, Antelope Lake is located in the northeastern part of the Mt. Hough Ranger District. It is a small remote lake with 15 miles of shoreline. Surrounding the lake are mountains blanketed with pine and fir trees. Protected coves around the lake attract several species of migratory birds. The campgrounds are usually open by Memorial Day weekend and close by the middle of October. These dates are subject to change depending on the snow level in the area.

Getting there

Antelope Lake is located 30 miles NE of Taylorsville on the Genesee/Antelope Lake Rd. From Janesville, on Hwy 395, take County Rd. 208 for 4 miles, then FS Rd. 28N01 for 9 miles, turn right on FS Rd. 28N03 for 2 miles.

Supplies

Groceries, ice, bait and souvenirs, along with gasoline may be purchased at the nearby towns of Greenville and Janesville.

- water, vault toilets, tent/trailer

Long Point Group Campground

- 4 units
- Reservations only
- \$75 site fee (25 people per site)
- water, vault toilets, tent/trailer
