



Order No. 19-05-01
USDA Forest Service
Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit
Cave Rock Closure

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a), and to protect resources, the following acts are prohibited within the Cave Rock Closure Area of the Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit, as shown on Exhibit A. This order is effective from February 16, 2005, through February 15, 2008.

1. Going into or being upon the Cave Rock Closure Area, except for the areas listed below.
 - a. U.S. Highway 50.
 - b. The area within 25 feet of the lake shore, as shown on Exhibit A.
 - c. The old trestle trail, as shown on Exhibit A.
 - d. The trail to the cave, as shown on Exhibit A.
 - e. The power line road, as shown on Exhibit A.

36 CFR 261.53(c).

2. Using or possessing a motor vehicle within the Cave Rock Closure Area, except for U.S. Highway 50. 36 CFR 261.56. For purposes of this prohibition, a wheelchair is not considered to be a motor vehicle. A wheelchair is defined in the Americans with Disabilities Act to be "a device designed solely for use by a mobility-impaired person for locomotion, that is suitable for use in an indoor pedestrian area." 42 USC 12207(c)(2).

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions contained in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571, and 3581.
