**CAMPFIRE PROHIBITED WITHIN
DESOLATION WILDERNESS**

Pursuant to **36 CFR 261.50(a)**, and to provide interim direction to protect wilderness resources pending review and revision of the Desolation Wilderness Management Guidelines, the following act is prohibited within the boundaries of Desolation Wilderness, under our jurisdiction:

- (1) Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire **36 CFR 261.52(a)** except for completely enclosed portable campstove with spark arrested chimney or a portable stove using gas, jellied petroleum or pressurized liquid fuel.

Pursuant to **36 CFR 261.50(e)**, the following persons are exempt from this order:

- 1. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty. **36 CFR 261.50(e)(4)**
- 2. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission. **36 CFR 261.50(e)(1)**

This prohibition is in addition to the General Prohibitions in **36 CFR, Part 261**.



**CAMPFIRES PROHIBITED WITHIN
DESOLATION WILDERNESS**

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), and to provide interim direction to protect the wilderness resource pending a review and revision of the wilderness management plan, the following is prohibited within the boundaries of the Desolation Wilderness (see attached map) which is under our jurisdiction:

(1) Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire, except a completely enclosed portable campstove with spark arrested chimney or a portable stove using gas, jellied petroleum or pressurized liquid fuel. **36 CFR 261.52 (a).**

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), each of the following persons is exempt from this order.

(1) Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission. The issuing officer may include in any such permit such conditions s/he considers necessary for the protection or administration of the road, trail or National Forest System, or for the promotion of health, safety, or welfare of its users.

(2) Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.


This prohibition is in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR, Part 261.
