The White Mountain National Forest seeks qualified applicants to fill 4 Student Trainee positions using the Pathways Internship Program. The positions are fulltime employment for the 2014 field season (May – August). This outreach allows us to identify interested individuals. Duties: The duties of this position include assisting higher grade archaeologists in conducting historical background research and locating and monitoring historic structures and archaeological sites through field survey. Survey methods include walkover survey and shovel test pit excavation. This position will assist in documenting sites by filling out site forms, taking photographs, drawing site maps, and using GPS/GIS.

Duties: As a Student Trainee in a Timber Stand Improvement Position you will spend time in both the office and in a field environment assisting other USFS employees in preparing recently harvested sites for seedling establishment and release with brushsaws and chainsaws. Some of your duties will include forest sampling to determine species composition, size classes, age structure and stocking density. You will learn about silvicultural prescriptions and applying those systems on the ground through harvest layout and marking. This position will have an opportunity to learn about USFS wildlife, fisheries, fire and recreation activities and programs.

Eligibility:

The Pathways Internship Program is designed to provide students with opportunities to explore Federal careers while still in school. Students may be hired on a temporary basis for up to one year (Intern / NTE). Eligibility includes current students in an accredited high school, college (including 4-year colleges/universities, community colleges, and junior colleges); professional, technical, vocational, and trade school; advanced degree programs; or other qualifying educational institution pursuing a qualifying degree or certificate.  - Tell us why you are interested and give us your contact information. Tell us if you are a student, veteran or have other special status in Federal hiring.
 - Ask any questions you have about the work, housing, or application process.

- Hiring will be completed by the end of April. Work starts mid/late May.
