- Get familiar with USAJobs. See “How to Apply for a Job on USAJobs” at: http://www.fs.fed.us/fsjobs/USAJOBS_Instructions.pdf
- Create an account on USAJobs website. <https://my.usajobs.gov/Account/Account>
- Post all relevant documents to your USAJob account, i.e. current transcripts, degree completion documentation, letters of recommendations, and veterans preference documentation
- Must submit both resume and transcript(s) in pdf format as part of USAJOBS application
- Transcript(s) must have student name, university name, declared major, degree plan (i.e. bachelors), enrollment status (i.e. F/T, P/T), and GPA
- Be concise but provide sufficient information and details to capture all your pertinent experiences. Federal government resumes are more detailed & longer than a typical resume.
- Click on the preferred vacancy announcement link in the table above, once vacancy announcement opens click apply online.
