

## Instructions for the Prescott National Forest Fuelwood Tag System

2014

The Prescott National Forest has implemented a tag system for forest product removal (fuelwood).

The tags, in quarter cord increments, must be attached to the load of fuelwood and be visible from the rear of the vehicle. The tags can be nailed (i.e. nail or screwdriver), taped or stapled to a piece of the wood. They must be attached in some manner that keeps them visible but make sure they are secure so they don't come off in transit. The tags must be attached before you leave the cutting area and always during transit. Tag what you have already gathered even if you are not finished cutting. **If a vehicle is transporting fuelwood on National Forest lands and has no visible tag(s) they will be stopped by Forest personnel.**

Each quarter tag is numbered and corresponds with the tag numbers on your permit.

How to tag the load-For example, if you are transporting 3 quarters of a cord of wood you would need to display 3 tags. Permittees must punch out, with a pen/pencil/hole-puncher, the MONTH, DAY, DAY OF WEEK and AM/PM on each tag. Permittees are still required to fill out the Product Removal Record on the front page of the fuelwood permit in conjunction with "tagging the load".

**For the year 2014-YELLOW colored tags are only valid for dead/down fuelwood permits. GREEN tags are only valid for green fuelwood permits.**
