## Accomplishments Provided with Recreation Fees:

### Developed Recreation Sites

- Funded season startup and shutdown at Williamson River Campground:
  - Pumped vault toilets.
  - Installed garbage cans and fee tubes and updated information boards.
  - Primed and tested the water system.
  - Contracted an arborist who removed a large hazard limb above the tent pad at a popular campsite.
- Upgraded and sealed vault restroom door jams to prevent rodent access and damage.
- Purchased supplies and supported campground hosts at Cottonwood, Digit Point, Dog Lake, East Bay, Lofton, and Thompson Reservoir campgrounds. These volunteers performed light maintenance and cleanup work, provided information and education to overnight and day use visitors, and improved site security and compliance by their presence.
- Funded annual installation and removal of the Digit Point boat dock system.
- Maintained, operated and cleaned Williamson River, Digit Point, Lofton Reservoir, Dog Lake, Cottonwood Lake, Campbell Lake, Deadhorse Lake, Marster Spring, Silver Creek Marsh, East Bay and Thompson campgrounds and Mt McLoughlin Trailhead.

## Special Feature

Towering above the surrounding landscape more than 4,500 feet, it's not surprising that the views from Mt. McLoughlin's 9,495 foot summit are described as incredible! Many hikers start their ascent at the Mt. McLoughlin Trailhead making it one of the most popular on the forest. The round trip from the trailhead to the summit is a steep 11 miles, some of it over boulder-strewn terrain. Be prepared with plenty of water, appropriate clothing and a GPS and/or map.

## Additional Fremont-Winema Accomplishments

### Recreation Rentals

- Completed maintenance and cleaning tasks between visiting groups at Aspen Cabin, Currier Guard Station, Drake Peak, Bald Butte and Hager Mountain lookouts. Purchased propane for recreation rentals equipped with propane fixtures.

### Partnerships

- Partnered with Portland Community College and supported a student in the Occupational Skill Training Program. This student provided visitor information and maintained various recreation fee sites. Recreation fees purchased supplies and materials needed to complete these tasks.
