Venture to the heart of the New Hampshire's White Mountains for a fun and fulfilling summer adventure restoring the the historic Fabyan Cabin. Built in 1923 for just \$75, the Fabyan Guard Station is the oldest structure built by the Forest Service in New Hampshire's White Mountain National Forest and is one of the oldest remaining guard stations in the eastern United States. The cabin has weathered well, but repairs are needed to its foundation, door and windows to see it through another century.

The Fayban Cabin is located along the old Cherry Mountain Road near the Fabyan train station, 30 minutes south of Lancaster, NH. Participants will be camping onsite.
