## Accomplishments Provided with Recreation Fees:

- Completed operation and maintenance tasks, provided visitor information and assistance, patrolled sites and checked compliance at numerous campgrounds. Campground hosts and seasonal employees shouldered this work, ensuring consistent operational support during the camping season.
- Administered the Hoover Wilderness Backcountry Permit Program on the Bridgeport Ranger District.

## Special Feature

The spectacular beauty of the Sierras encompassed by Hoover Wilderness has been treasured for generations. Established as a Primitive Area in 1931, it is one of the original Wilderness areas created by the Wilderness Act in 1964. A well-maintained trail system makes it extremely popular with visitors. Recreation fees support the Hoover's permit system which helps manage use and protect resources.

## Additional Humboldt-Toiyabe Accomplishments

- Funded extended operational hours at district offices and field patrols between Thanksgiving and Christmas in support of the extremely popular Christmas tree program. In 2013, visitors purchased approximately 5,600 tree cutting permits.
- Administered and inspected backcountry operations for 63 outfitter and guides under special use permit.


