



Recreation fees are an investment in outdoor recreation. Current and future generations will benefit as 95% of the funds are reinvested in the facilities and services that visitors enjoy, use, and value.

Accomplishments Provided with Recreation Fees:

- Funded seasonal employees who completed key maintenance work at campgrounds across the forest.
- Supplemented appropriated funds and purchased essential cleaning and maintenance supplies.
- Operated, maintained and tested 13 drinking water systems that supplied water to campgrounds, rental cabins and Stuart Guard Station Interpretive Center.
- Completed operations and maintenance tasks, provided visitor information and assistance, collected fees and checked compliance at campgrounds.
- Constructed and installed 34 new campground information signs to complement new kiosks installed in 2012.
- Replaced deteriorated picnic tables, fire rings and information boards at Manti Community, Lake Hill and Ferron Reservoir Campgrounds.



Installed new expanded metal picnic tables in several campgrounds.

Replaced picnic table top and bench planks as needed.



Special Feature

Known for its proximity to excellent rock climbing, Maple Canyon Campground also offers great hiking, biking and horseback riding opportunities. Though somewhat steep, the hiking loops provide access to climbing routes and panoramic views into Sanpete Valley. In 2013, American Hiking Society volunteers, supported with recreation fee funds, constructed a new trail segment and platform beneath a popular arch viewpoint above the campground.


