



Recreation fees are an investment in outdoor recreation. Current and future generations will benefit as 95% of the funds are reinvested in the facilities and services that visitors enjoy, use, and value.

Accomplishments Provided with Recreation Fees:

- Funded printing of forest Motor Vehicle Use Maps for distribution. In total, the region printed 133,000 maps.
- Reviewed and updated Recreation Site Facility Master Plans for Dixie and Bridger-Teton National Forests.
- Produced short, informational videos featuring campgrounds and other recreational facilities for Boise and Sawtooth National Forests. These videos have been posted on the forest web sites, YouTube and www.recreation.gov.
- Supported piloting of Digital Ranger smartphone application for Dixie and Fishlake National Forests.
- Designed information board layouts for Manti-La Sal and Payette National Forests to assist visitors when arriving at trailheads, campgrounds and other developed sites.
- Re-printed forest visitor guides for Payette National Forest.
- Funded printing of R4 Volunteer Opportunity Guides for those interested in volunteer opportunities on forests or in the Regional Office.
- Supplemented funding for major maintenance projects and purchases for the Tony Grove, Left Hand Fork, Card and Diamond Fork Guard Stations on the Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest. These guard stations will be proposed for inclusion into cabin rental program.

Special Feature

A Utah Conservation Corps crew surveyed and photographed almost 1,000 camping, picnic, trailhead and other access routes for input into the National Forest Recreation Management Accessibility Conditions data base. Fee funds supported this effort and also development of an Apple IPAD application so survey information could input directly into digital forms. - Supplemented funding to complete maintenance and improvement tasks on cabins proposed for inclusion in the cabin rental program: Summit Springs and Paradise Guard Stations on the Ashley National Forest, Green River Lakes Cabin on the Bridger-Teton National Forest, Al Taylor and Clear Creek and Diamond Creek Guard Stations on the Caribou-Targhee National Forest, and Paddy Flat and Lake Fork Cabins on the Payette National Forest. Work included re-roofing; painting; and installing windows, toilets and heaters.


