Prohibited Acts on National Forest System Roads

Pursuant to **36 CFR 261.50(a) & (b)**, the following acts are prohibited on all National Forest System Roads, as described by the order.

I. Using any type of vehicle prohibited by the order. **36 CFR 261.54(a)**

A. Operating a motorized vehicle on the following National Forest System Roads:


1. NFS 2016000, known as Indian Creek Road.
 - a) Shall be opened from January 1-March 31 for use by over Over-Snow Vehicles from mile 0.0 to 3.0 on Indian Creek Road.
 - b) May be closed upon District Ranger approval in cases of low snow depth in order to protect vegetative resources.
2. NFS 2025000, known as the 20 Mile Spur Road.
 - a) Closed year-round.
3. NFS 2026000, known as the 19 Mile Road.
 - a) Closed year-round.

Pursuant to **36 CFR 261.50(e)**, each of the following are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission. **36 CFR 261.50(e)(1)**
2. Any Federal, State or Local Officer, or member of any organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty. **36 CFR 261.50(e)(4)**
3. Persons engaged in a business, trade, or occupation in the area with an approved operating plan authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission. **36 CFR 261.50(e)(5)**

This Order amends and supersedes Order 10-05-51-12-01, signed by Forrest Cole and dated February 6, 2012. These Prohibitions are in addition to the General Prohibitions in **36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A**. This Order may be made more restrictive by temporary order issued by the Regional Forester or the Forest Supervisor as needed to promote public safety, and to protect public property and resources.
