



TONGASS NATIONAL FOREST KETCHIKAN AREA

PROHIBITED ACTS • ORDER NO. 94-09

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on National Forest System lands and waters, and Forest Development Roads and Trails under my jurisdiction.

FIRE

1. Possessing, discharging or using any kind of firework or other pyrotechnic device during periods of high fire danger; Fire Danger Rating III (High) or higher, and applies to all persons within the affected area. 36 CFR 261.52(f)

Exempted under the authority of 36 CFR 261.50(e)(6) are all aircraft, marine and vehicle emergency flares and fuses, when possessed or deployed for emergency purposes. Each District Ranger may designate, at their discretion, areas for the discharge of fireworks.

SPECIAL CLOSURES

2. For the protection of public health and safety, it is prohibited to go into or be upon any lands, waters, roads, or trails of the Tongass National Forest, Ketchikan Area-- 36 CFR 261.53(e)
 - (a) When possessing a firearm on his/her person while under the influence of alcohol.

[This Prohibition is consistent with portions of Alaska Statute 11.61.210(a)—Misconduct Involving Weapons in the Fourth Degree]

FOREST DEVELOPMENT ROADS

3. Operating a vehicle in violation of speed, load, weight, height, length, width, or other limitations specified by the order. 36 CFR 261.54(d) *THIS SECTION SUSPENDED BY R-10-96-01 ON 5/17/96*
 - (a) Operating any motor vehicle on a Forest Development Road in violation of State Law.

Exempted under the authorities of 36 CFR 212.7(a)(2)(i), and 36 CFR 261.50(e)(6), are any vehicles operating in the furtherance of forest management goals and objectives, as authorized by the Forest Supervisor (see Regional Order FSM 7731.52 4/90 SUPP 43).

OCCUPANCY AND USE

4. Camping for a period longer than allowed by the order. 36 CFR 261.58(a)
 - (a) Camping for more than 30 days during any 6-month period on National Forest System lands;
 - (b) Camping for more than 14 days during any 30-day period within any developed recreation site or area.

This Order supersedes and terminates Order 93-02, dated 2/8/93, and revised Order 93-02, dated 5/27/94. These Prohibitions are in addition to the General Prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A. This Order may be made more restrictive by temporary orders issued by the Regional Forester or the Forest Supervisor as needed to promote public safety, and to protect public property and resources.
